

We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter III, Section 5, do hereby Grant, subject as hereinafter mentioned, out of our Common Fund to the Incumbent of each of the Benefices whereof the names and the names of the counties and dioceses wherein the same are respectively situate are stated in the first three columns of the Schedule hereto, and to his successors Incumbents of the same Benefice, one yearly sum or stipend of the amount stated in the fourth column of the said Schedule opposite to the name of the Benefice, such yearly sum or stipend to be calculated as from the date stated in the fifth column of the said Schedule opposite to the name of the Benefice: Provided always that if at any time lands or other hereditaments sufficient in our opinion to produce the said yearly sum or

stipend, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the Benefice in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend or for such part thereof our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine: Provided also that such yearly sum or stipend is granted upon and is payable only subject to the conditions (if any) stated with reference thereto at the foot of the said Schedule: Provided lastly that this Instrument which is intended to be executed in several parts (one part for each Diocese concerned) shall operate only as a single grant in favour of each of the Benefices mentioned in the said Schedule.

We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of the benefaction which has been duly secured in favour of each of the Benefices whereof the names and the names of the counties and dioceses wherein the same are respectively situate are stated in the first three columns of the Schedule hereto, which benefaction (consisting, except where otherwise indicated, of a bequest) is described in the fourth column of the said Schedule opposite to the name of the Benefice, and in respect of which benefaction we have agreed to pay to the Incumbent of the Benefice, and to his successors Incumbents of the same Benefice, the yearly sum (if any) the amount of which

is stated in the fifth column of the said Schedule opposite to the name of the Benefice, do hereby Grant, in pursuance of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter III, Section 5, out of our Common Fund to the Incumbent of the Benefice and appropriate for the benefit of such Incumbent and his successors Incumbents of the same Benefice to meet such benefaction the capital sum the amount of which is stated in the sixth column of the said Schedule opposite to the name of the Benefice, in respect of which capital sum, so long as the same or any part thereof shall remain in our hands, there shall be paid by us to the Incumbent for the time being of the
