Rome, August 8. N.S.

HE Differences between the Emperor and this Court are in a very fair way of accommodation, and the Pope intends in a day or two to admit the Imperial Ambassador to Audience. An Express is arrived here from Modens, who brings advice that the Dutchels of Modena is delivered of a Daughter. The French and Vinetian Ambaffadors had P ivate Audiences of the Pope this week, intending to delay their Publick Audiences rill feveral Points rouching the Ceremonial are fettled by the Congregation of Cardinals appointed for this purpose. The Cardinal Barberino Protector of the Affairs of Poland, hashad several Conferences with the Queen Dowa ger of Poland, in order to adjust some Dif-ficulties about the manner of her receiving the Ambassadors of Crowned Heads, who perfist in their Refusal to visit her, till she consents to allow them the same Honours as are paid by her to the Cardinals.

Turin, Aug. 8. Mr Hill, Envoy Extraordinay from His Majesty of Great-Britain, returned hither on the 6th Instant from Milan, and being informed that the Duke of Savoy is on his Journey hither from St. Maurice, he went this day to seet him at Chivaz. On the 7th Instant a Gentieman arrived here from Bruffels with the Charracter of Relident from the Elector of Bavaria.

Milan, August 12. The Prince of Vandemont, our Governor, went from hence on the 8th Instant to meet the Duke of Savoy, as he passed through Cosmo in his return from St. Maurice to Turin, and having conferred with his Royal Highness, he returned hither this day. On the 10th the Duke and Dutchess of Parma came hither incognito, returning home from St. Maurice, and they have

been splendidly entertained by our Governour.

Leghorne, Aug 14. Admiral Aylmer sailed from hence with the Squadron of Men of War under his Command on the 11th Instant, having been treated, during his stay here, with great Civility and Respect. He designs to call at Genous, and from thence to proceed to the Coast of Spain.

Vinice, August 14. The Turkish Officers, who

The Turks do infift, that the Town of Novi, fituate on the Borders of Croatia, be left to them, which delays the finishing the Business about settling the Limits between the German and Turkish Dominions, but it's hoped this Matter will be adjuited by the English and Dutch Ambassadors at the Port, who, as Mediators of the lare Treaty at Carlowisz, have been defired by this Court to employ their good Offices to that effect. Our last Advices from Hungary 12y, the German Forces continue to work with great Application on the Fortifications that are making at Arat, and the other Frontier Places; That both the Germans and the Turks are cultivating great Tracts of Land on those Borders which have lain waste a considerable time by reason of the War, and are rebuilding several Villages that were ruin'd, and that they have a free Entercourse and Trade with each

Francfort, August 23. Baron Muller, Envoy from the King of Sweden to the Elector Palatine, who came hither some days ago from Duseldorp, is gone to attend his Electoral Highness at Weynheim. The Heer Binder, Commissioner from the Emperor for adjusting the Dutchess of Orleans's Pretensions on the Palatinate, is returned hither from Swalback, and the French and Palatine Commissioners are likewise daily expected here, in order to renew their Conferences for fertling this Matter. We hear, part of the French Troops that were encamped near Landau, are marching back to their Quarters, and that the rest are to continue there till the entire Payment be made of the 300000 Livers which the Elector Palatine has agreed to give the Dutchess of Orleans, of which 100000 is already paid.
