**T**HE Differences between the Emperor and this Court are in a very fair way of accommodation, and the Pope intermits in a day or two to admit the Imperial Ambassador to Audience. An Express is arrived here from Modena, who brings advice, that the Dutchess of Modena is delivered of a Daughter. The French and Venetian Ambassadors had Private Audiences of the Pope this week, intending to delay their Publick Audiences till several Points touching the Ceremonial are settled by the Congregation of Cardinals appointed for this purpose. The Cardinal Barberino Protector of the Affairs of Poland, has had several Conferences with the Queen Dowager of Poland, in order to adjust some Difficulties about the manner of her receiving the Ambassadors of Crowned Heads, who persist in their Refusal to visit her, till she consents to allow them the same Honours as are paid by her to the Cardinals.

*Turin, Aug. 8.* Mr Hill, Envoy Extraordinary from His Majesty of Great-Britain, returned hither on the 6th Instant from Milan, and being informed that the Duke of Savoy is on his Journey hither from St. Maurice, he went this day to meet him at Chivaz. On the 7th Instant a Gentleman arrived here from Brussels with the Character of Resident from the Elector of Bavaria.

*Milan, August 12.* The Prince of Vandemont, our Governour, went from hence on the 8th Instant to meet the Duke of Savoy, as he passed through Cosmo in his return from St. Maurice to Turin, and having conferred with his Royal Highness, he returned hither this day. On the 10th the Duke and Dutchess of Parma came hither incognito, returning home from St. Maurice, and they have been splendidly entertained by our Governour.

*Leghorne, Aug 14.* Admiral Aylmer sailed from hence with the Squadron of Men of War under his Command on the 11th Instant, having been treated, during his stay here, with great Civility and Respect. He designs to call at Genoua, and from thence to proceed to the Coast of Spain.

*Venice, August 14.* The Turkish Officers, who came hither some time ago with Passes for Signior Seranzo, appointed by this Republick to be their Ambassador Extraordinary to the Grand Signior, having performed their Quarantaine at the Lazaretto, came on Monday last into this City, and were nobly entertained by his Excellency, who designs in few days to begin his Journey to Constantinople, where it is believed his Presence will be necessary for adjusting with the Ministers at the Port the Differences that are arisen between the Venetian and Turkish Commissioners for settling the Limits. Our last Advices from Dalmatia give an account, that the Imperial, the Venetian, and the Turkish Commissioners, met together on the 29th past on the Frontiers of Dalmatia, in order to settle the Limits between the Dominions of their respective Masters.

*Warsaw, Aug. 13.* An Extraordinary Meeting of the Senate was held yesterday, to consider of the Affair of Elbing, and what Instructions are to be given to the Commissioners who are to

Treat with those appointed by the Elector of Brandenburg for accommodating this Business; As also what Number of Forces it will be necessary to keep on foot in this Kingdom; By what Means their Subsistence shall be provided for, and what Quarters the Country is to provide for them. They met again this day, and it's thought this may oblige the King to delay for some days his Journey to Teplitz, his Majesty being desirous to see these Matters determined before he leaves this Place. The Baron Werner, Envoy from the Elector of Brandenburg, arrived here yesterday, and the other Commissioners whom his Electoral Highness intends to send to this Place, are shortly expected.

*Vicna, August 15.* Count Zedlinski, Envoy Extraordinary from the Emperor to the Crown of Poland, is returned to Warsaw. Our last Advices from Andrinople say, the Grand Signior had left that Place, in order to his return to Constantinople; And that Ibrahim Bassa, whom he is sending to the Emperor with the Character of his Ambassador Extraordinary, would begin his Journey hither about the middle of this Month. The Turks do insist, that the Town of Novi, situate on the Borders of Croazia, be left to them, which delays the finishing the Business about settling the Limits between the German and Turkish Dominions, but it's hoped this Matter will be adjusted by the English and Dutch Ambassadors at the Port, who, as Mediators of the late Treaty at Carlowitz, have been desired by this Court to employ their good Offices to that effect. Our last Advices from Hungary say, the German Forces continue to work with great Application on the Fortifications that are making at Arat, and the other Frontier Places; That both the Germans and the Turks are cultivating great Tracts of Land on those Borders which have lain waste a considerable time by reason of the War, and are rebuilding several Villages that were ruin'd, and that they have a free Entercourse and Trade with each other.

*Francfort, August 23.* Baron Muller, Envoy from the King of Sweden to the Elector Palatine, who came hither some days ago from Dufeldorp, is gone to attend his Electoral Highness at Weynheim. The Heer Binder, Commissioner from the Emperor for adjusting the Dutchess of Orleans's Pretensions on the Palatinate, is returned hither from Swalback, and the French and Palatine Commissioners are likewise daily expected here, in order to renew their Conferences for settling this Matter. We hear, part of the French Troops that were encamped near Landau, are marching back to their Quarters, and that the rest are to continue there till the entire Payment be made of the 300000 Livers which the Elector Palatine has agreed to give the Dutchess of Orleans, of which 100000 is already paid.

*Brussels, August 28.* The Elector of Bavaria returned hither the 26th Instant from Marimont, where he has been to divert himself with Hunting. The Count of Dietrichstein, Envoy Extraordinary from the Emperor, who accompanied his Electoral Highness, is also come back to this Place, and will have his Audience of Leave of the Elector.

for and Electores to morrow, intending shortly to return to *Spain*. The Count de Berzeick came hither yesterday from *Flanders*; His Journey to *Madrid* is quite put off, the Court of *Spain* having revoked the Orders that were sent him to repair thither. Don *Quera*, the Spanish Ambassador, has received Orders from *Spain* to return to his Station at the *Hague*. The Count d'Ansel, Governor of the Province of *Luxembourg*, is arrived here from *Luxembourg*. The Count de Tirinmont and the Sieur de Broeckhoven, Commissioners from *Spain* for settling the Limits of the *Spanish Netherlands*, are still here, expecting the King of *Spain's* Approbation of the new Instructions that have been drawn up, touching the Matters in Dispute between them and the French Commissioners.

*Loos*, August 28. The King intends to go on Monday to *Dieren*, which being near the place appointed for the Encampment, His Majesty will continue there the most part of the next week, and intends to be at the Camp for the first time on Tuesday; the Review is to begin on Wednesday, and will be over on Friday; the next day His Majesty will return to this Place; and the Troops will begin to decamp the same day, in order to return to their respective Garrisons. The Duke of *Wurtemberg* is still here, who with the Earl of *Athlone* is to command at the Review under the Prince of *Nassau-Saarbrück* General of the Dutch Forces, the first as General of the Foot, and the other as General of the Horse.

*Hague*, August 28. The Regiment of Horse and Foot-Guards are marched to the Review near *Arnhem*, where they will arrive on Monday next. The 25th Instant, being the Feast of St. Lewis, the Sieur de Bonrepos on that occasion gave a splendid Entertainment to the Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Quality. The Sieur Dyckvelt is on his departure for *Brussels*. The Sieur Pretorius, Envoy from the Duke of *Conland*, is gone to *Amsterdam*.

*Paris*, August 29. N. S. By Letters from *Lisbon* we have received an Account, that the Princess Mary-Sophia-Elizabeth, Queen of *Portugal*, died there on the 4th of this Month, in the 33d Year of her Age, after a Sickness of several days; She was of the House of *Newbourg*, Daughter of Philip-William late Elector *Palatine*, and Sister to the present Empress and Queen of *Spain*. An Express is arrived here from *Bar-le-Duc* with an Account, that the Dutches of *Lorraine* was safely delivered of a Son in that City on the 26th Instant. Money continues very scarce here, so that the Farmers of the King's Revenues who are obliged to pay considerable Sums, are forced to borrow it at 14 and 15 per Cent. Several Boats are lately come to this place from *Roan* with *Corn*, which has been imported there from Foreign Parts, which Supplies come very seasonably to lessen the excessive Price which Bread bears at present. The Marquis de *Cascaes*, Ambassador from the King of *Portugal* to this Court, is gone to *England*. The Letters from *Marsilles* of the 12th Instant give an Account, that the Squadron of French Gallies, commanded by the Marquis of *Forville*, returned thither that day from the Coast of *Italy*.

*Plymouth*, August 22. The *Hopeful*, Thomas *Lzenburg* Master, and the *Antogoa Merchant*, Anthony *Eycourt* Master, both of *New-England*, and bound home from *London*, put into this Port on the 17th Instant, as did also the *Resolution* of *London*, Walter *Creeker* Master, bound from *Hamburg* to *Malaga*; the *Pearl* of this place, Abraham *Mangles* Master, arrived here the 18th Instant from *Riga*. Yesterday came in here the *Success* of *London*, Simon *Davis* Master, bound for *Barbadoes*, and the *Hopeful* of *Leicester*, *Greovil Parity* Master, bound from *Newus* to *London*; the *John and Mitchell* of *London*, William *Spremann* Master, bound home from *Antogoa*, arrived here this day.

*Comes*, August 19. The *Canterbury*, Henry *Tregon* Master, and the *William and Robert*, Christopher *Osborne* Master, both of *London*, and bound to *Provincias*; and the *Ann* of *London*, James *Morris* Master, bound to *St. Sebastians*, are now in this Port.
