

for and Electores to morrow, intending shortly to return to Vienna. The Count de Berzeick came hither yesterday from Flanders; His Journey to Madrid is quite put off, the Court of Spain having revoked the Orders that were sent him to repair thither. Don Quira, the Spanish Ambassador, has received Orders from Spain to return to his Station at the Hague. The Count d'Arzel, Governor of the Province of Luxembourg, is arrived here from Luxembourg. The Count de Tirinost and the Sieur de Broeckhoven, Commissioners from Spain for settling the Limits of the Spanish Netherlands, are still here, expecting the King of Spain's Approbation of the new Instructions that have been drawn up, touching the Matters in Dispute between them and the French Commissioners.

Loos, August 28. The King intends to go on Monday to Di ren, which being near the place appointed for the Encampment, His Majesty will continue there the most part of the next week, and intends to be at the Camp for the first time on Tuesday; the Review is to begin on Wednesday, and will be over on Friday; the next day His Majesty will return to this Place; and the Troops will begin to decamp the same day, in order to return to their respective Garrisons. The Duke of Wirtemberg is still here, who with the Earl of Athlone is to command at the Review under the Prince of Nassau-Saarbrück General of the Dutch Forces, the first as General of the Foot, and the other as General of the Horse.

Hague, August 28. The Regiment of Horse and Foot-Guards are marched to the Review near Arnhem, where they will arrive on Monday next. The 25th Instant, being the Feast of St. Lewis, the Sieur de Bonrepos on that occasion gave a splendid Entertainment to the Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Quality. The Sieur Dyckvelt is on his departure for Brussels. The Sieur Pretorius, Envoy from the Duke of Conland, is gone to Amsterdam.

Paris, August 29. N. S. By Letters from Lisbon we have received an Account, that the Princess Mary-Sophia-Elizabeth, Queen of Portugal, died there on the 4th of this Month, in the 33d Year of her Age, after a Sickness of several days; She was of the House of Newbourg, Daughter of Philip-William late Elector Palatine, and Sister to the present Empress and Queen of Spain. An Express is arrived here from Baar-le-Duc with an Account, that the Dutches of Lorraine was safely delivered of a Son in that City on the 26th Instant. Money continues very scarce here, so that the Farmers of the King's Revenues who are obliged to pay considerable Sums, are forced to borrow it at 14 and 15 per Cent. Several Boats are lately come to this place from Roan with Corn, which has been imported there from Foreign Parts, which Supplies come very seasonably to lessen the excessive Price which Bread bears at present. The Marquis de Caftas, Ambassador from the King of Portugal to this Court, is gone to England. The Letters from Marsilles of the 12th Instant give an Account, that the Squadron of French Gallies, commanded by the Marquis of Forville, returned thither that day from the Coast of Italy.

Plymouth, August 22. The *Hopeful*, Thomas Loxenburg Master, and the *Antogoa Merchant*, Anthony Eyrcurt Master, both of New-England, and bound home from London, put into this Port on the 17th Instant, as did also the *Resolution of London*, Walter Crenker Master, bound from Hamburg to Malaga; the *Pearl* of this place, Abraham Mangles Master, arrived here the 18th Instant from Riga. Yesterday came in here the *Success of London*, Simon Davis Master, bound for Barbadoes, and the *Hopeful of Liverpool*, Greovil Parity Master, bound from Newus to London; the *John and Mitchell* of London, William Symons Master, bound home from Antogoa, arrived here this day.

Comes, August 19. The *Canterbury*, Henry Tregon Master, and the *William and Robert*, Christopher Oslome Master, both of London, and bound to Philadelphia; and the *Ann of London*, James Morris Master, bound to St. Sebastians, are now in this Port.
