The Albert Medal (Posthumous)

Commander Albert Francis George Thomas Hallaran, Royal Navy (Retired).

On a very dark night a motor boat came alongside Commander Hallaran's ship to take off the Pilot. A swell made this boat roll and pitch heavily, and a Stoker was thrown overboard between it and the ship's side. He was seen to be in difficulties, and was in danger of being crushed as the swell kept heaving the boat against the ship.

Commander Hallaran climbed into the boat, jumped into the sea, and swam round to help him. He got the Stoker back to the boat, but as he did so he was thrown against it. His skull was fractured and he was drowned before he could be got back on board.
