Notice is hereby given that the Treasury have fixed at 3 per cent., as from the 8th November, 1941, and until further notice, the rate of interest to be adopted in discounting future payments in respect of instalments of an annuity charged by the Tithe Act, 1936, for the purpose of determining, in accordance with the Redemption Annuities (Extinguishment and Reduction) Rules, 1937, the amount of consideration money to be paid for the redemption of the annuity.
