WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 15th day of November, 1941 (N/P.M. 3017/41), in the words following, viz.:

"Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such

restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas the Regulations for the government of Your Majesty's Naval Service provide for the award of the Naval Long Service and Good Conduct Medal and Gratuity to naval ratings and Royal Marines who have completed 15 years' approved pensionable service:

And whereas Continuous Service naval ratings and Royal Marines who do not re-engage to complete time for long service pension are detained during the present emergency for extended service when their existing engagements expire and we consider that men so detained should be eligible for the award of the Naval Long Service and Good Conduct Medal without Gratuity on completion of 15 years' approved service:

We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your "we beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorise us, at our discretion, to award the Naval Long Service and Good Conduct Medal without Gratuity accordingly.

"And whereas Mr. W. R. Rodger and Mr. J. Mylward, Senior Chief Officers, have already served a considerable number of years in their present rank without increase of pay, and unless provision is made to the contrary, will continue to do so until retirement in 1945 and 1944 respectively:

"And whereas these are the only Officers who can ever attain eight years' seniority in the rank of Senior Chief Officer, and we consider that these two Officers should be granted a special increment of pay of 2s. a day on attaining such seniority:

"And whereas we consider that as from the same date, whilst continuing to serve as Senior Chief Officer of the Royal Naval Shore Wireless Service.
