**PROHIBITION, DATED DECEMBER 16, 1941,  
UNDER SECTION 5 OF THE CUSTOMS AND  
INLAND REVENUE ACT, 1888 (51 & 52 VICT.  
C. 8), OF THE USE IN BEER OF CERTAIN  
SUBSTANCES.**

Whereas it appears to the satisfaction of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury that Dulcin (*para*-Phenetyl Carbamide) and the compounds of Dulcin and all other substances being chemical or artificial products which furnish the chemical reactions of *para*-Phenetyl Carbamide are capable of being used in the manufacture or preparation for sale of Beer and that the use of any of the said substances may affect prejudicially the interests of the Revenue.

Now the said Lords Commissioners, under the power conferred upon Them by Section 5 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1888, do hereby prohibit the use of any of the said substances in the manufacture or preparation for sale of Beer.

**ALLIED POWERS (MARITIME COURTS) ACT,
