He 31 paft arrived here the fane of this Port from Morlaix; the 1 inflant the Anne and Sufan from the fame place, and this day the Margaret, Elifabeth and Mary from St. Malees, all of them telling us of the great preparations made by the French for Sea and Land fervice.

Weymouth, April 5. The 31 paft arrived here the Elifabeth of this Pore in 6 weeks from Virginia, where the left the Fleet of London and Briffol Merchants half laden, and might in few days be ready to put to fea in order to their return home.

This day came in the Sarah of this place in three days from Croyfick in France, by whom we are told that the French have levied many Soldiers and prefied many Seamen to be fent aboard their Fleet which is haftning out with all convenient diligence, and are to Rendezvous at Rochelle, and from thence to fail together for Thoulon, there to take aboard them the fuccors defigned for the relief of Candia.

Rome, Mart. 13. The Pope has ordered his Nephew Baly Vincingo Kolpigliofi to haften the Equipping of his Gallies for his voyage into the Levant to the relief of Candia, and has ordered a large Standard with the Crofs to be given him, which is to be born by him as his Admiral in the expeditions and is fending another to the Duke de Beaufort to be born by the French Admiralemployed in the fame levvice:

Libbon, March 19, Here is lately put in a French Vefiel, much complaining of the ill dealing of the Turks of Algiors i who tame on board her and took from her 250 Negto's, to the value of 50000 Crowns upon the Portuguele accounts.

From Goa we are informed, that in April last the Vices Roy of that place fet out a Fleet of fourteen ships from 22 to 44 Guas apiece, with 44 other smaller armed Vesses on which he embarked himself, to give fresh reputation to sub Arms of Portugal, by steepping upon the Prince of Massac, in revenge of their expirition fome years fince from that place 3 but was twice griven back again by storm a but that a part of this F eet commanded by a Brother of D. Grancesco de Melo, had entred that Haven and burnt about 80 seil of ships of all lores, passing afterwards by Ormes, gathering in the arrears of the half Customs of Kongo They (eiled allo 4 large ships laden with Arabian.Horles, Silks 5 and much Pearl, with three other foldiers.

The self of the Fleet m:t with and made prize of a Ship of extraording ywelce coming from Moulsellapstan, and two others from Danda near Bombain, whole Prince the Portuguele have again made tributary to them.

Vienna, March 24. Here is lately arrived the Sieur Taarafch an Hungarian Gendeman from Upper Hungary, who was the 21th inftant admitted to a long Audience by the Emperour is wherein he gave His Imperial Majefty an account of the flare of the affairs of that Kingdome : aly firming that the States of the Countrey had refolved is aflemble themselves the 28th of this moneth at Esperies to contile about their affairs 5 which will haften the Voyage of Marte Commifficients which are nominated to be fent from the Emperour to those United Provinces.

We have daily advice of several diffurbances railed in that Kingdom by the Turks, and that a party of them had lately appeared about Zatmar, committing divers infolencies and diforders, in fo much as the Governour of Zatmar had been obliged upon the complaints made to hims to march out again them with a firong party, but the Turks having timely intelligence of his approach, reired themfelves. We know nothing as yet of certain concerning the Intentions of the Turks, but fuddenly expect the return of the Courrier who was fent the 4th inflant to the Baron de Calaneva at Lariffa. The Baffa of Buda has ordered a general View to be taken of all the Turkish forces in Hungary, whereof a confiderable part may be fent to re-inforce the Visier in Gandia. Legorn, Mart. 25. The Court is at prefent kept here, where the Great Duke has laid an Embargo upon all Veffels till his Gallies shall be fitted up and put to fea, those onely that are bound to the Westwards will be permitted to go off. Y sterday arrived here the Friend/hip, the Thomas and Katherine, with the Violet from Gallipoli laden with Oyls and bound for England; but as yet the Captains of them are unrefolved whither to expect the Convoy of the Leopard which they looked for here, or top proceed without her; Eight fail more of English Merchant, are lading at Gallipoli, whither more are hasfining upon the fame account.

The 20th inflant arrived here the fhip Madona del Rofario and the Sasto Michaele in 20 days from Tripoli, where they left the fhip Homobone, and a French Bark which were lading on Merchants accounts

which were lading on Merchants accounts. They self is that two Privaterrs of that place were there with all diligence fitting up, that Five others were put to lea for the Grand Seigniors fervice, and two others truifing in fearch after prize, of which they had no late news: That they had fent out a confiderable body of an Army againft the Moors, and were bufily employed in raifing a Fort, which when finished would ferve as a fridle to refrain their incurfions; to which end they employed great numpers of men about it, and particularly all the Christian flaves, and that fome of their parties being fent out, had taken priflorer a Moor, faid to be an eminent Commander amongs the Moors.

The 22 came in the thip St. Nicholds di Folentino in 30 days from Alefandria, from wherce came in her company another ship Commande, by Captain Garbonello, whole company the left 12 days fince off Maltha. They left at Aleffanderia & Christian thips lading for feveral parts of Christendern, and 25 Turkish thips for feveral parts of the Ottoman Dominions. Two thousand Bastels of Powder lay there to be transported into Candia for the supply of the Aimy, but they wanted mens who generally refu-ted the employments having no confidence of any good fuc-gets in that fervice. They tell us that a Chiaus was embark-ed at Damiata, employed by the Grand Segnior into Bara bary, to obtain from them the affiftance of what Ships and Gallies could be spared for his service; and that 20 days lince off the Cape di Spartivento at the foot of Italy, they had chace given them by a thip of Barbary, which torced them to throw over-board lome part of their lading, and to put into Meffina, from whence they departed in company of an English Fregat on her return from Smirna, and put in at Maples ; and that on the Friday before their arrival her a they were again purfued by Five thips, from whom they lat yed thenilelves in Civita Vecchia

Genoid, March 27. Two of the Gallies belonging to this Republick lie ready to put to Sea, one of them bound for Rome with our Envoye Seignior Geo. Luce Durageo, and and the other with Seignior Geo. l'attiffa Rouere, fent under the fame i harafter to the Lour. of France.

On Tuelday the last week arrived hone Don Diego foppo'o Regenced the Council-of Altay, on his way lor Madrid, where he is to refide s he ving been transported hither in one of, our Gallies from Naples - and may with the first oppo tunity imbark himfelf for spain.

About the fame time arrived here two Feluca's from Farcellons with Don Gio. de Roinss, a Gentleman fent from his Highne's Don Pietro Prince Regent of Portugal, to the Pope; who after a little thay was attended to Lerice by one of the Gallies b. longing to this Republick.

From willin we are informed, that by Order of the prefent Governour the Marquif Spinola, all the Garriions in that State were changed, and a general Mufler of tell the Militiz was appointed towards the end of this moneth; as which time 'tis believed he will make fome Reformation fot the esfe of the People.

The Duke d' Offuna 'eis belie ed may be fuddenly expe-Red to entet upon the Government of t' at State.

The Marqueis de Mortara, Widow to the late Governout, has received from the Queens bounty an affiftanceof Four thoufand Crowns, with a promife of a Thouland Crowns a Moneth during her flay in the Government of Milan; her Son to be made a Gentleman of his Majeflies Chamber, as foon as he comes to Age, with the fume Commands which his Father enjoyed during his life.

Dantzig, Mart. 30. The Gentry of Poland are prepuring to meet in Arms in the Field at the Election, which the Primate the Arch-Bishop of Gaese endeavours to prevent and distand, the better to avoid any troubles and disorders which may drife upon any disfutes concerning that affair.

The Envoye from Muscovy had his Audience a little after his arrisol at Warfam from the Arch-Bifhop of Gnefne in the prefence of many Senators and principal perions of the N billity ' by him the Great Duke has defied, that D pathesmight be appointed to Trear with him for the eftablifhment of a perfetual peace between both Nations, a acquainting them that the Tartars' had made their addreffes to him for a peace, which he would not eftablifh with them without first communicating it to the Republick of Poland and obtaining their content, according to the agreement upon the late Truce of fatther informing them, that the Swedes wêre finding their Committioners to him for the composing and ending of all disputes ab ut the bounds and limits in Liwonis, and fitting and eftablifhing Trade and Cömmerde between thath, defiring that fome Committioners' might be fent from Poland to take tare of their conce. nments in this Negotiation.

Let ers from Warfam of the 22th Inftant, tell us that the Vice-Chancellour and the Marefhal of the Court were the b arrived 3 but that the later was departed thence for Lamburgh, to confer there with the Grand Marefhal and Prince Radgevis about the affairs of Poland. 'I is generally faid that the Grand's are agreed among it themfelves upon the Election 3 but 'tis nor yet known who is the Perion defigned by the n.' In the mean time care is taken for the Entertainment of all the Nobility and Gentry at yheir Affembly 3 and a Proclamation is publifit, That no Corn barraneported from any patt of the Country about Warfam, 'I is faid a Marriage is intended between the Duke Dometrius Wiefnienski and the Dutchels Ragot ki, and that Foreign Minifers are again permitted to return to Warfame.

From *Ukrania* we are told of the arrival there of two Furkish Basia's, who are putting firing Garrisons into all confiderable places; the fame Letters' afforing is that the Collacks beyond the Driper have generally submitted themfelves to the Molcovics.

Amfterdam, April \$177 The Squadron of thips intended for the streights utder the Command of Vice-Admiral VanGhent is fitting up with all possible diligence, the Admiral being already equipped, and may fail upon the first Orders. The 6 and 7 inftant arrived at Retterdam two fhips from Lourd anx, I from Rochelle, 5 from St. Hubes, and 2 from Bilbao. Several fhips are lately fome in at Hip from the Falthick Seas 4 and divers at the rexel from Bourdeaux, Gharantoz the Ifle of Rb, and Nantes : allo one thip from Bayonne and ano.her from Curifson.

Thole from St. Hubes inform us of the arrival there of a Spanish ship from the West-Indies, affirming that 7 French Men of War and 23 Merchant ships well armed had sailed to Honduras, where they landed some men and plundered a little Town, wherein they found much wealth; and that the Chevalier du Pless had met with one of the Spanish Gallions, which after a sharp fight be took, but was himself killed in the Dispute: the Gallion faid to be very rich, to the value of above 300 thouland Crowns.

From Alcosnt we are adviled, that a fhip called the King David, was put in there, havi g had a fharp encounter with 2 of the Corlairs of Barbary, who after a long Dispute were forced to eave her to her Voyage.

Hague, April 12. Montieur de Pompone, Ambastador from His most Christian Majesty, has delivered his Credential Letters to the State, but intends not to make his publick Entry before Easter.

"Tis faid, the Portuguele Ambaffsdour Don Francefce de Melo may in little time depart hence, the Prince his Mafter having defigned him for the Court of Rome.

The Duke of Holftein has lately written to the States, defiring them to interpole between him and the King of Denmark for the flating and compating all difputes about his pretentions to the County of Oldenburg.

The Heer Appleboom, Envoye Extraordinary from Swedeland, intends on Monday next to depart hence, and to return home, the Heer Makeshal reliding here in his place.

Hull, April 4 Yesterday and on Friday last failed hence 3 Vessels, belonging to this place, laden with Cloth, Lead, and other Commodities of these parts, for Holland, three others for the East Country, and several others for the Coasts, Onely one Danish ship lately arrived from Norway.

London, April 5. This day arrived here incognito His Highnels the Prince of Tallany, having been met and complemented in His Materies. Name at Brautfard by the Lord Vilcount Mazdeville in one of his Majeflies Coaches, and at his arrival attended by Sir William Killegrew with a Complement from Her Majefly, by the Barl of Peterborough from His Royal Highnels, and from Her Royal Highnels by Sir William Papell the Malter of her Horie.

Portfmouth, April 6. On Sunday laft in the evening, Sir Thomas Allen on the Manmouth, having with him the Mary, Princefs and Dartmouth, came to an Anchor before this Road off St. Hellens 4 and yesterday morning, came in by the Needles to Spitthead, the Briftol having convoyed home the Katherine and Goncord two Merchant thips from Lisbonne.

Two Dutch Marchant fips with an English Hoy are now riding at Sti Hellons, and feyeral others at Comes, all of them outwards boand.

On Sunday last passed by the Isle of Wight, the Loyal-Subject and the London, two East-India thips, for the Downs, having been rive Monether at lea on their return.
