The Courier that was fent some days ago by the Senate to Vienna, to desire Leave for the Guman Regiments of Bareith and Saltsbourg, lately arrived here from the Mores, to pals thro' the County of Tyrol in their return home, is come back with the Emperor's Confent to what was defixed, and the faid Regiments are thereupon gone to Verona, from whence they are to continue their March home; But the Republick has resolved to keep in their Service the Regiment of Wirtemberg which came with them from the Levant. We have received Advice by a Ship lately come from the Levant, that the Men of War who have on board Signior soranzo, Ambassador from this Republick to the Port, and his Retinue, had put into Corfus in their Voyage to Turkey. Our Letters from Constantinople of the 12th of the last Month sing or Assessment to the Constantinople of the Signior Month give an Account, that the Grand Signior and his whole Court arrived there the 8th from distrinople, as did likewise my Lord Pages, Am-

Hamburgh, Officher 20. An Extraordinary Courier arrived here last Saturday from Vienna, with some Dispatches for Count d'Eck, Envoy from the Emperour, who, immediately after the receipt of them, fent away two Expresses, the one to the Court of Deimark, and the other to the Court of Smeden, with Letters relating, as is supposed, to the Affair of Helstein, which the Emperor and several orber Princes are endeavouring to accom-modate. 'n the mean time we hear from Sweden moda≥. that the Regiments which lay at Carelferoom, in order to be sent to Pomeren, had orders to embark the 21st Instant; and from Denmark they write, that the Squadron of Denish Men of War pur to Sea on the 17th Instant, having Orders, as 'twas said, to oppose the swedes, in case they attempted to transport any Forces to Pemeren. Our Letters from the Dutchy of Holftein say, the Duke of Holftein's Forces continue to work with great application on their new Forts, notwirhstanding the great Inconveniences they suffer from the cold and rainy weather we have at prefent, and that they have already put some of these Fortifications in a posture of Desence.
