Cádiz, Octob. 1. N. S.

Admiral *Exeter*, with a Squadron of English Men of War, came to an Anchor in this Bay on the 21st of the last Month. They were saluted by the Guns from the Town, and the usual Visits and Compliments passed between the Admiral and the Governor of this Place; And this day the Admiral with the said Squadron sailed from hence for England. The *Medway*, Capt. *Baker* Commander, is gone to *Tangier* about the Business of the Redemption of Captives, and is shortly expected again in this Port. This day came in here 4 Spanish Men of War from *Biscay*, which are designed for the *West-Indies*, and 2 or 300 Soldiers are raising here to be put on board them. The *Katherine*, *Alexander*, *Cassia* Commander, and six other Merchant Ships, are arrived here from *London*; as also the *Maryland* Merchant from *Plimouth*, the *Mary* Galley from the *Canaries*, the *Good Hope* from *New-Castle*, the *Globe* Galley from *Newfoundland*, and the *Katherine* from *Bilboa*.

Madrid, Octob. 8. The Court continues at the *Escorial*; And the King of Spain is in perfect Health. He has appointed the *Marquis de Villa Franca*, Councillor of State, to confer with the French Ambassador as his Commissary, in the room of the Cardinal of *Cordova* deceased. The *Marquis de los Balbaces* having resigned his Employment of Major-Domo Major, or Lord High Steward of the Queen's Household, is succeeded in that Employment by the *Marquis de Castro Monte*. The Duke of *S. Juan* left this Place on the 3d Instant, in order to repair to the Island of *Sardinia*, off which he is lately made Vice-Roy. The Duke of *Uzeda* is made a Councillor of State, and went from hence on the 5th on his Embassy to *Rome*.

Venice, Octob. 10. The Senate have chosen Signior *Domenico Badover* to be Captain-General of the *Gulph*. The Courier that was sent some days ago by the Senate to *Vienna*, to desire Leave for the German Regiments of *Bavaria* and *Saltsbourg*, lately arrived here from the *Morea*, to pass thro' the County of *Tyrol* in their return home, is come back with the Emperor's Consent to what was desired, and the said Regiments are thereupon gone to *Verona*, from whence they are to continue their March home; But the Republick has resolved to keep in their Service the Regiment of *Wirttemberg* which came with them from the *Levant*. We have received Advice by a Ship lately come from the *Levant*, that the Men of War who have on board Signior *Soranzo*, Ambassador from this Republick to the Port, and his Retinue, had put into *Corfu* in their Voyage to *Turkey*. Our Letters from *Constantinople* of the 12th of the last Month give an Account, that the Grand Signior and his whole Court arrived there the 8th from *Alexandria*, as did likewise my Lord *Pages*, Am-

assador from His Majesty of *Great-Britain*, and the Heer *Colliers*, Ambassador from the *Swiss* General to the Port. They write from *Dalmatia*, that the *Venetian* and *Turkish* Commissioners for settling the Limits continued their Conferences, and had proceeded in the execution of their Commission as far as *Vargonatz*.
Warsaw, Octob. 8. The *Sieur Lezinsky*, General of the *Greater Poland*, will depart from hence in 2 or 3 days on his Embassy to the Port. The Cardinal Primate is shortly expected here from *Radziowsky*, the Senate being to assemble in few days, to consider how to raise the Sum due from this Crown to the Elector of *Brandenburgh*, pursuant to the Agreement lately made with his Electoral Highness about the Affair of *Elbing*. We have Letters from *Lemberg* of the 3d Instant, which give an Account, that the *Bassa of Caminnic* having received Advice, that *Sarvsk*, and the other Places in *Moldavia*, which the *Poles* were to restore to the *Ottoman* Port, in pursuance of the Treaty of *Carlowitz*, were actually delivered up to the *Turks*, he marched out of *Caminnic* with the Garrison under his Command, and the Commissioners of *Poland* took possession of that City, into which they have put a good Garrison.

Copenhagen, Octob. 16. The Squadron lately fitted out by the King of *Denmark*'s Order, which consists in 16 Men of War from 60 to 80 Guns, and 5 Frigates the least of 30 Guns, is in a readiness to go to Sea; and the Land Forces which are to be put on board these Ships, to wit, a Regiment of Marines, and a Draught of 22 Men out of each Company of Foot quartered in their Parts, are ordered to embark to-morrow. In the mean time we have an Account from *Sweden*, that 4 Regiments of Foot, of 1344 Men each, lay at *Carlskroona* ready to be transported to *Pomerania*, and that a Squadron of 15 Men of War from 26 to 34 Guns, are appointed to Convey them. The King of *Denmark*'s Journey to *Holftein* continues uncertain. Brigadier *Krabbe* is made Colonel of the King's Horse-Guards.

Vienna, Octob. 10. The Emperor having invited the Dutchess of *Hanover* to come hither, to be present at the lying in of the Queen of the *Romans*, her Daughter, we have received Advice that she intends to leave *Modena* on the 12th Instant on her Journey hither. The young Count of *Raventlau* is arrived here from *Copenhagen* with the Character of Envoy Extraordinary from the King of *Denmark*, to notify to the Emperor the Death of the late King of *Denmark*, and the Accession of the present King to the Crown. The Emperor has declared the young Count *Winningratz*, First Deputy from the House of *Austria* at the Imperial Diet in the room of Count *Lamberg*, who is preparing for his departure from hence on his Embassy to *Rome*. Count *Orting* will be going from hence in a day or two on his Embassy to the Port; and an Express was sent this week to *Belgrade*, to give notice thereof to the *Bassa* of that Place, that to the *Turkish* Ambassador, who is coming hither, may be ready to meet Count *Orting* on the Frontier between *Belgrade* and *Peterwaradin*; the said Ambassadors having Orders to
