## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 23rd January, 1942, at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Acts, 1939 to 1941, to the ground of 66 consecution.

to the amount of £65,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 26th January, 1942, to Saturday, the 31st January, 1942, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England and later than 1 and 1 the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

DANGEROUS DRUGS ACTS, 1920 TO 1932.

WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORITIES.

(PURSER DAVIES.)

Whereas Purser Davies, M.C.; M.B., Ch.B. Edin.; D.P.H., R.C.P.S. Eng., whose registered address is 51, Courtfield Gardens, London, S.W.5, has been convicted of an offence against the Dangerous Drugs Acts, 1920 to 1932:
And whereas the said Purser Davies cannot, in my

opinion, properly be allowed to be in possession of or to supply any drug or preparation to which the Dangerous Drugs Regulations. 1937, or any drug

to which the Raw Opium, etc., Regulations, 1937,

apply:
Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Regulation 7 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937, and by Regulation 5 of the Raw Opium, etc., Regulations, 1937, I hereby withdraw from the said Purser Davies, the authorities conferred by the said Regulations upon him to be in possession of and to supply the drugs or to be in possession of and to supply the drugs or preparations to which the Dangerous Drugs Regu-

lations, 1937, and the drugs to which the Raw Opium, etc., Regulations, 1937, apply:

And I hereby direct that it shall not be lawful for the said Purser Davies to give prescriptions for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations,
