NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE, CONTRIBUTORY PENSIONS AND WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION ACT, 1941.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the National Health Insurance Joint Committee and the Minister of Health, acting jointly after the expiration of at least forty days from this date, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by subsection (3) of section 1 of the National Health Insurance, Contributory Pensions and Workmen's Compensation Act, 1941, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, to make regulations to be entitled the National Health Insurance (Certificates of Exception) Regulations, 1942.

And that, on account of urgency, the National Health Insurance Joint Committee and the Minister of Health, acting jointly under section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, made regulations dated 5th January, 1942, and entitled the National Health Insurance (Certificates of Exception) Regulations, 1942, to come into operation forthwith as provisional rules and to continue in force until regulations have been made in accordance with the provisions of section 1 of that Act.
