A PROCLAMATION. WILLIAM R.

Whereas this present Parliament stands Prologued to Thursday the Sixteenth Day of November next; And it being His Majesties Will and Pleasure, that the same Parliament shall, upon the said Sixteenth Day of November, Meet and Sit for the Dispatch of Divers Weighty and Important Affairs: His Majesty therefore, with the Advice of His Privy-Council, hath thought fit to Issue this His Royal Proclamation for Declaring and Publishing the same. And all the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens and Burgesses of the House of Commons, are hereby Required and Comanded to give their Attendance accordingly at Westminster on the said Sixteenth Day of November.

Given at Our Court at Kensington the Twenty fourth Day of October, 1699. In the Eleventh Year of Our Reign.

Rome, Octob. 10. N. S. The Pope went this week to see a Chapel the Jesuits have lately built, in which they have placed the Body of Ignatius Loyola, the Founder of their Order; This Building for its bigness is looked upon as the most magnificent in this City, and has cost them 120000 Crowns. The Queen-Dowager of Poland has erected here an Academy of Learned Men, who were assembled in her Palace yesterday, it being their first Meeting, and she gave the Members of this Society, of which there are divers Cardinals and other Persons of Quality, a very splendid Entertainment. It's said, the Cardinal d'Arquien, her Father, intends to leave this Place next Spring, in order to go and spend the residue of his days in France.

Venice, Octob. 17. The Senate are regulating several Matters about their Forces that are to be kept on foot. They have resolved to maintain constantly 12000 Land-Forces in the Morea, and to have 12 Men of War and 16 Gallies always in a readiness to go to Sea, and are now considering what Troops to keep on the Frontiers of Dalmatia, and in their other Dominions. The Regiment of Wirtemberg, one of the Three German Regiments that returned hither lately from the Morea, is gone for Germany, the Conditions on which the Senate were willing to retain them in their Service not having been accepted. The number of Pilgrims who come from Germany and other Parts to the Jubilee, is very great, and above 3000 of them have within these few days passed through this City. It is discoursed here that the Cardinal de Medicis intends shortly to quit the

Cardinals Cap, and to Marry the Princess of Guastalla. Our last Advices from Dalmatia give an Account, that the Venetian and Turkish Commissioners, who are met on the Frontiers of that Province to settle the Limits, continued their Conferences with good Success, and were advanced as far as Macharska, having regulated the Boundaries from the Sea to that Place.

Warsaw, Octob. 14. Te Deum was sung last Sunday in our Cathedral, for the Evacuation of Caminiec by the Turks. The Cardinal Primate is daily expected here, and the Senate are to meet to consider of the Business of Elbing, and divers Senators who were gone into the Country, are returned hither for this purpose. Signior Davia, the Pope's Nuncio, intends to go in a day or two to attend the King of Poland in Germany, and has already sent away his Servants and Equipage. The Sieur Lezinsky, General of Great Poland, will depart from hence in few days on his Embassy to the Port. Prince Alexander, one of the Sons of the late King of Poland, is at present in this City, and much indisposed; He intends, if he can recover his Health, to go with Prince Constantine his Brother to wait upon the King of Poland in Germany, and from thence to Rome to pay a Visit to the Queen-Dowager their Mother, and to be present at the Jubilee. An Apartment is fitting up in the Castle of this City for the Queen of Poland, who it's thought will come hither with the King from Germany.

Copenhagen, Octob. 24. The Squadron lately fitted out here, went to Sea this morning, consisting in four Men of War of 66 Guns each, one of 54, and seven of 50, and four Frigats, the biggest of 26 Guns, and the least of 16. Count Guldenslew altered his Resolution of going out with this Squadron, and is gone for Norway. The late King of Denmark's Funeral is appointed to be on the 25th Instant, after which the King will fix the time of his departure from hence for the Dutchy of Holstein.

Vienna, Octob. 17. The Imperial Court returned hither last Wednesday from Ebersdorf. The Emperor to engage the Rasians, who came during the late War from the Turkish Territories, and settled themselves in his Dominions, not to return into the Ottoman Empire, has granted them an Exemption from Taxes for several years. The Count of Raventlau, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Denmark, has frequent Conferences with the Emperor's Ministers touching the Affair of Holstein. There being Advice, that the Grand Signior's Ambassador to the Emperor is arrived at Belgrade in his way hither, Count Otting has resolved to begin his Journey to the Port in a day or two; Our Letters from Croatia say, the Imperial and Turkish Commissioners for settling the Limits, who were conferring together at Novi, intended to be present at the Meeting these Ambassadors are to have on the Frontier near Salankmeny in which they were endeavour to adjust several Matters relating to the Limits. returned hither from the Court of Savoy, where he has been with the Character of the Emperor's Envoy Extraordinary to make the Compliments of Congratulation on the Birth of the Prince of Piedmont. It is discoursed here, that Count d'Harbach, the Emperor's Ambassador to the Court of Spain, will shortly be recalled, and Count Wallestein sent thither in his stead.

Frankfort, October 25. The Baron Muller Envoy from the King of Sweden, who has continued here some time, has received Orders from the King his Master to go and Compliment the Duke of Lorraine on the Birth of the Prince his Son, and will accordingly begin his Journey to Nancy in a day or two. The Elector Palatine, who is at present at Newstadt, intends to go from thence in few days to Weynsheim, and after a short stay there, to return to his Residence at Dufeldorp. They write from Ratisbonne, that the Envoy of Saxe-Cobourg has notified to the Ministers of the several Princes of the Empire, residing in that City, the Death of the late Duke of Saxe-Cobourg, and that the said Duke leaving no Issue Male, is succeeded by the Duke Bernard of Saxe-Meinigen according to the Constitutions of that Family.

Hamburg, October 27. They write from Frederickstadt, that 16 Companies of Foot, part of the Duke of Holstein's Forces that were employed in Building the new Forts in the Duchy of Holstein, are returned thither, and that the rest of those Troops are likewise marching towards their several Quarters, the cold rainy weather hindring them from continuing this work. We have no certain Advices concerning the Swedish Squadron, and the Forces they seem resolved to transport from Carelsroone to Pomeran. They write from Leipzick, that the King of Poland intended to go from thence the latter end of this week for Auerberg, and that the Electores of Brandenburg was returned from Leipzick to Berlin.

Lege, Octob. 27. The States of the Countrey of Liege met here on the 21st Instant, to consider of the Supplies demanded of them by the Elector of Cologne. 'Tis said, His Electoral Highness, who is at present at Boual near Bonn, intends in the beginning of the next month to go to Brussel, in order to be present at the Christning of the young Prince, Son to the Elector of Bavaria his Brother, being desired by the Pope, who is to be his Godfather, to represent him on this occasion. The Magistrates of this City being informed, that divers Officers in the French Service were raising Recruits in the Neighbourhood of this Place, they have signified to them, that if they do not depart out of the Territories of Liege within 24 hours, they shall be looked upon as Enemies of this State, and treated accordingly.

Hague, Octob. 30. N. S. The States of Holland and Westfriesland intend to separate to morrow. The Deputies from the several Colleges of the Admiralty continue here, and have frequent Conferences with the Deputies of the States-General, and 'tis said, they have resolved to enter a Protest against the War, and to fit out a Squadron next Spring, to cruise in the Straights for the security of their Trade. The Discourse of rendering the River Issel and the Lower Rhine Navigable is renewed, and several Projects relating to this matter have been presented to the States-General. 'Tis said, he Sieur Van der Hulst will be appointed to go as Resident from this State to Moscow. The Prince and Princess of Nassau-Siegen, who have been here some time, are returned to Germany. The Count de Nassau-Saarbruck is gone to his Government of Nimegez. The Count de Talaru, Ambassador from France to His Majesty of Great-Britain, is gone for England by the way of France. The two Princes of Hesse, Sons to the Landgrave of Hesse-Cassel, who lately came to this place from Germany, are likewise gone for England, as are also the Count de Noyelles, Baron Tessau Envoy from the Elector of Brandenburg, and the Sieur Pretorius Envoy from the Duke of Cooland; And the Count de Frela, Ambassador Extraordinary from the Duke of Savoy, will embark for England in a day or two. Monsieur Hesterman, Envoy from the Elector Palatine to the States General, is returned to Germany.

Warrmouth, Octob. 24. Admiral Boscawen, with the Squadron of His Majesty's Ships under his Command, came here on the 20th Instant from the Straights.

London, Octob. 23. This day sailed from hence the Mary Anne, Captain Kaye Commander, and the Jane and the Argonne, John White Master, both bound to the Barba-

does; and the Resolution, Thomas Brittain Commander, bound to Virginia.

Kensington, October 25. The King has been pleased to Confer the Office of Lord Chamberlain of His Majesty's Household upon his Grace Charles Duke of Shrewsbury, to whom His Majesty was pleased to deliver the Key and White Staff this morning.
