We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of the benefaction which has been duly secured in favour of each of the benefices whereof the names and the names of the counties and dioceses wherein the same are respectively situate are stated in the first three columns of the Schedule hereto, which benefaction (consisting in each case of a bequest) is described in the fourth column of the said Schedule opposite to the name of the Benefice, do hereby Grant, in pursuance of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter III, Section 5, out of our Common Fund to the incumbent of the benefice and appropriate for the benefit of such incumbent and his successors incumbents of the same benefice to meet such benefaction the capital sum the amount of which is stated in the fifth column of the said Schedule opposite to the name of the benefice, in respect of which capital sum, so long as the same or

any part thereof shall remain in our hands, there shall be paid by us to the incumbent for the time being of the benefice the yearly sum the amount of which is stated in the sixth column of the said Schedule opposite to the name of the benefice, or such part thereof as shall be proportionate to any balance of the same capital sum which shall so remain in our hands, the yearly sum so payable in respect of the grant to commence as from the date stated in the seventh column of the said Schedule opposite to the name of the benefice: Provided always that this Instrument which is intended to be executed in several parts (one part for each Diocese concerned) shall operate only as a single grant in favour of each of the benefices mentioned in the said Schedule.
