**DANGEROUS DRUGS ACTS, 1920 TO 1932.****SUSPENSION OF WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORITIES.**

(WARREN GEORGE REES MORRIS.)

Whereas in pursuance of the powers conferred on the Secretary of State by Regulation 7 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937, and by Regulation 5 of the Raw Opium, etc., Regulations, 1937, the Authorities granted by the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937, and the Raw Opium, etc., Regulations, 1937, to duly qualified medical practitioners to be in possession of and to supply the drugs or preparations to which these Regulations apply, were by Notice published in the London Gazette and Edinburgh Gazette on the 25th June, 1940, withdrawn from Warren George Rees Morris, M.R.C.S. Eng., L.R.C.P. Lond., then residing at Coombe Down House, Coombe Down, Bath, who had been convicted of an offence against the Dangerous Drugs Acts.

And whereas at the same time a direction was given by the Secretary of State that it should not be lawful for the said Warren George Rees Morris to give prescriptions for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937.

Now therefore, I hereby suspend, until further order, the operation of the said Notice of Withdrawal and of the said direction regarding prescriptions.
