

February, 1922, Schedule I, (Service element) (b), and Schedule II (b) and under the Schedule to Order in Council of the 9th March, 1939, should not be paid to Seamen and Marines who are entered only for a period of hostilities:

"And whereas by Order in Council dated the 24th October, 1940, it was provided that the provisions of Order in Council dated the 21st September, 1939, should not apply to mobilised members of the Royal Fleet Reserve, Royal Naval Reserve, Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve and Royal Naval Volunteer (Wireless) Reserve, who, essentially in the interest of the Service, are discharged from their respective Reserve engagements and execute 'Hostilities Only' engagements to serve in other branches of the Naval Service not allowed in the Reserve; and that in such circumstances the time spent under a 'Hostilities Only' engagement should be allowed to reckon as mobilised service in the Reserve for the purposes of the award of compensation in the event of invaliding or death during the currency of such engagement and for the purpose of qualifying for the full Reserve Gratuity in the case of Royal Fleet and Royal Naval Reservists:

"And whereas we are of opinion that the provisions of Order in Council dated 21st September, 1939, should likewise not apply to Naval ratings who essentially in the interest of the Service are transferred from normal Naval engagements to 'Hostilities only' engagements, and that in such circumstances the men should be regarded for the purposes of the award of invaliding compensation as still serving under their normal engagements:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the further amendment of Order in Council dated 21st September, 1939, accordingly.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 31st day January, 1942 (N.24784/41), in the words following, viz:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of service in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we consider that an allowance of 6d. a day should be paid, as from the 13th January, 1942, to the rating of the Wireman (M/S) Branch who is responsible for the maintenance of certain electrical sweeping apparatus in each minesweeping vessel:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction payment accordingly."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria,

Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 15th day of January, 1942, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Great Creaton, in the County of Northampton and Diocese of Peterborough:

"Whereas by the Will dated the 8th February, 1938, of the late Vernon Bryan Crowther-Beynon, of Beckington House, Beckington, in the County of Somerset, the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice was devised to the Bishop of Peterborough:

"And whereas Edgar Osbert Giffard, a Flight-Lieutenant in Your Majesty's Royal Air Force, and Audley Gray, of Hill End House, Salwarpe, Droitwich, in the County of Worcester, Schoolmaster, are the Trustees of the said Will who but for the hereinbefore recited devise would be the persons entitled to present or nominate to the said Benefice in case the same were now vacant and they are desirous that anything which by way of further assurance or otherwise may be required effectually to carry out the devise may be done and application has been made to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners that a Scheme under the said Acts may be prepared for the said purpose and submitted to your Majesty in Council:

"And whereas the said Edgar Osbert Giffard and Audley Gray and the Right Reverend Claude, Bishop of Peterborough, as Bishop of the Diocese wherein the said Benefice is situate and also in token of his willingness to accept the said devise, are consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof they have executed the same):

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Great Creaton shall be transferred to the said Claude, Bishop of Peterborough, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Peterborough for the time being."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Peterborough.
