#### ROYAL AIR FORCE.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the following awards in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:—

#### Distinguished Service Order.

Acting Group Captain Kenneth Brian Boyd Cross, D.F.C.

Since the commencement of operations in the Libyan campaign, this officer has displayed inspiring courage and leadership. In spite of his onerous duties on the ground, Group Captain Cross has constantly participated in the air operations and his indomitable courage and skill have contributed materially to the fighting efficiency of the force he commands.

Acting Wing Commander Frederick Ernest ROSIER. (37425).

This officer has commanded a fighter wing since the commencement of the operations in Libya. Both in the air and on the ground, his courage and efficiency have been inspiring throughout. On one occasion, when one of our fighter wings was being attacked by a large number of enemy aircraft, Wing Commander Rosier joined in the engagement. When breaking clear he observed one of our pilots who had been forced to land in enemy territory and, in an attempt to rescue him, Wing Commander Rosier landed He was unable to take off his aircraft. again owing to the close proximity of enemy forces. Nevertheless, both pilots eventually got away and, after many narrow escapes, succeeded in regaining base after a period of Wing Commander Rosier is an 3 days. outstanding fighter pilot and leader.

Bar to the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Acting Wing Commander Howard Clive MAYERS, D.F.C. (77976), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 94 Squadron.

This officer has led his wing on a large number of sorties during the Libyan cam-His mastery of tactics and skilful planning of operations have contributed largely to the many successes obtained. One day in December, 1941, during a machine gun attack against an enemy column, Wing Commander Mayers observed a member of his formation shot down by anti-aircraft fire. When the attack was concluded, he skilfully near the crashed aircraft although enemy vehicles were approaching, coolly waited for his comrade to reach him. Putting him in the seat, Wing Commander Mayers clambered in on top of him and took off as the enemy neared the aircraft. finally flew safely to base. This officer has always shown great courage and leadership. He has destroyed at least II enemy aircraft.

#### Distinguished Flying Cross.

Squadron Leader Vaughan Bowerman CORBETT (Can/C.299), Royal Canadian Air Force, No. 402 Squadron.

This officer has led his squadron on numerous bomber escorts over enemy occupied territory in France. Throughout, he has displayed great skill and leadership which have undoubtedly played a large part in the splendid protection afforded to the bomber formations. During these operations, Squadron Leader Corbett has destroyed at least I enemy aircraft and damaged several others. He has also participated in numerous low flying attacks on enemy territory during which his tactical ability and fine fighting spirit have proved an inspiration. This officer, who fought in the Battle of Britain, has always displayed the greatest keenness.

Acting Squadron Leader Ernest Wingfield MURRAY (40738), No. 11 Squadron.

This officer has participated in many sorties, most of which have been carried out during recent operations in Libya. He has at all times shown great skill and resource. In December, 1941, during an attack on enemy concentrations on the Mekili area, Squadron Leader Murray's aircraft received a direct hit from a small shell which cut the aileron controls and bent the throttle controls. In spite of this, Squadron Leader Murray maintained formation and, on return to base, landed his aircraft without causing it further damage. He has set an excellent example.

Lieutenant Henry Moseley Ellis, Royal Navy,

No. 826 Squadron.

During the past 6 months, this officer has performed excellent work as a flight commander. He has at all times displayed initiative and determination and has led the formation with outstanding success. One evening in January, 1942, Lieutenant Ellis carried out a difficult operation against an enemy convoy. In spite of strong enemy air and anti-aircraft opposition, he succeeded in torpedoing and sinking his objective. He afterwards flew his damaged aircraft safely to base.

# Distinguished Flying Medal.

Aus. 404009 Sergeant Robert James Whittle, Royal Australian Air Force, No. 250

Squadron.

This airman has proved himself to be a courageous and skilful fighter pilot. In one engagement when his formation was fighting against a superior number of enemy aircraft, Sergeant Whittle destroyed 2, probably destroyed another and damaged a further 2 of the enemy's aircraft. His determination is such that, on one occasion after being shot down, he walked 30 miles during the night rejoining his squadron for duty the next day. During an engagement 2 days later, Sergeant Whittle was wounded in the foot and arm and his aircraft was badly damaged but he flew back to base where he made a successful forced landing. Within 2 days, Sergeant Whittle resumed operational flying. He has destroyed at least 7 enemy aircraft.
