HE King of Spain Continues at the Eleurial, where he enjoys a perfect Health; It's faid at Court, that the Queen of Spain is with Child; Their Majesties return to this City remains fixed for the 2d of the next Month. The Prince of Bergh, who came hither some time ago from Brassels, rook his Leave of the King yesterday, and let out from hence this morning, on his return to Flanders. A Sum of 20000 Pifoles was fent this week to the Prince of Hiffe-Durmflact Vice-Roy of Catalonia; to Pay the Troops in that Province. The King has Declared the Cardinal de Giudice Protector of the Affairs of Sially at the Court of Rome, in the room of Cardinal d'Aguirre deceased. The Duke of Midina-Celi is made Counsellor of State. The Government of Malaga is given to Don Fernando de Argote. Don Bernandino de Pinedas Secretary to the Council of War, died forme days ago. We have riceived an Account of the Duke of Uccda's arrival at Barcelona, where his Excellency and his Family would embark on board two Galleys of the Duke of Tursis's Squadron, in order to proceed on his Embasly to Rome. The French Ambassador is returned hither from Morata near Toleso, where he has been splendidly enterrained by the Marquis of Leganez. They write from Ceuta, that the Moors continue still the Siege of that place, notwithstanding the ill Success they have hitherto had in this Undertaking.

fent at the Jubilee.

Vienna, Nov. 7. The Emperor has demanded of the States of Hungary a Subfidy of 4. Millions of Livers, and that they provide besides Subsi-stence for the Imperial Regiments which are quartered at prefent in that Kingdom. The Meeting of the Imperial and Turkish Ambasiadors on the Fronciers, is regulated in the following manner; Count Guido of Staremberg, Commander in Chief of the Imperial Forces in those Parts, is to receive the Twilib Ambailador near Salankemens at the Head of 500 Horse; The Seraskier of Belgrade is in like manner to receive Count Orting, the Imperial Ambassador, at the Head of the same number of Spahi's; and after having met and paffed the proper Compliments, the Commissioners appointed on both fides are to conduct the Am-bassadors on their Journeys, and defray their Expences. A Placaet was published this week, to give notice that the Chamber of Accounts are willing to receive the Proposais of any Persons that will undertake to furnish the Magazines of Vienna, Raab, and Comorra, with Ammunition and Provisions. Orders are fent likewise to the Commanders of the Imperial Troops in Hunary and Transilvania, to take care that the Magazines in those Provinces be well stored with Ammunition; And to hasten the Building of the new Fortifications near Arat, the Winter Season coming on, which will oblige the Troops that are employed therein, to discontinue that Work. Our Letters from Belgrade give an Account, that the Turkish Ambassador's Bangage was arrived there, and that he was expected in few days.

Francfort, Nov. 14. Monsieur Mullern, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Sueden, lest this Place on the 11th Instant, in order to go to Nancy to compliment the Duke and Dutchess of Lorrain in the Name of the King his Master on the Birth of their Son. The Elector Palatine's Forces continue to work with great diligence in rebuilding the Fortifications of Manheim, and a great number of Workmen are likewife employed in repairing the Castle of Hydelberg, that it may be ready by the next Spring for the reception of his Electoral Highness, who intends to make it the Place of his constant Residence, and has given Orders to the Courts of Justice of the Palatinate, which are now kept at W.ynkeim, to remove thither next March. Our Letters from Suitzerland fay, the Dutchess of Nemours had, at the Most Christian King's Defire, displaced Monsieur Monsin, who Commanded at Neuf-Charel, and given the Government of that Place to one Monlieur Molondin.

Cologne, Nov 17. The Elector Paintine having that the Command to their Winter-Quarters, stayed three days at Coolenia, where he and his

whole Court were entertained in a very splendid manner by the Elector of Triers, parted from thence yesterday, and passed this asternoon by this City towards Duseldorp; His Electoral Highness was Complimented by the Magistrates of this City, and Saluted with a Discharge of the Cannon round the Town Orders have been fent to the Inhabitants of the Dutchies of Bergh and Juliers to furnish a certain quantity of Corn for the Subsistence of the Elector Palatine's Forces, in lieu of the Subfidies they were to pay. The Baron of Bo:zelaer, Envoy Extraordinary from the Elector of Brandenburgh, arrived here the 14th Instant from Francfort, and intends in few days to go to Cleves, and from thence to Dufeldery, where it's faid he is to make Tome Remonstrances to the Elector Palatine concerning the Hardships that are put upon his Protestant Subjects.

The young Count of Ra-Hamburgh, Nov. 17. The young Count of Ra-ventlau arrived here last Saturday from Copenhagen, and the same day continued his Journey to the Elector of Branachburgh's Court. It's said, he is fent thither to desire Passage through his Ele-ctoral Highness's Dominions for 8000 Men of the King of Polana's Saum Forces, which the King of Denmark intends, if there be occasion, to take into his Service. They write from Holfein, that the Duke's Forces have provided such of their new Forts as are in a condition of Defence with good Garrisons, and with Artillery and Ammunition. In the Fort called the Hassianmer Schans, they have 8 Companies of Foot, 4 of Suedes, and 4 of Helsteiners; and in the Fort of Schwabsteed, and the Holmer Schans, are like Garrisons of Suedes and Holsteiners. The Suedes, which arrived lately in Pomeren from Carelferon, continue in their Quarters in the Neighbourhood of Steerin, and new Levies are making in that Country, in order to reinforce all the Sucd sh Regiments in those Parts with 300 Men each. The Danis at the same time continue to assemble their Troops near Rensbeurg, in order, as is believed, to attack the Forts lately built by the Holficiners; But it's hoped this Matter will be amicably composed by the Mediation of several Princes, who do employ their good Offices to this effect. And there are Letters from the Dutchy of Holfein which give an Account, that the Duke of Holfein's Forces had received Orders to leave off building their new Forts, and did accordingly discontinue that Work on the 11th Instant, which is said to be done in compliance to some Proposals that have been made by the Princes Mediators, containing among other things. That the building of the faid Forts should immediately cease; That the King of Sueden should order his Troops to march out of Helfiein; And that the King of Denmark should forbear attacking the Ports lately built in that Durchy for a certain time, during which a Treaty may be let on foot for adjusting this Matter. Our lest Letters from Cepenhagen say, the Danish Squadron of Men of War were still at Sea, and that a fortnight's Provisions had lately been sent them.
