Madrid, Octob. 23. N. S.

THE King of Spain continues at the *Escorial*, where he enjoys a perfect Health; It's said at Court, that the Queen of Spain is with Child; Their Majesties return to this City remains fixed for the 2d of the next Month. The Prince of *Borgh*, who came hither some time ago from *Brussels*, took his Leave of the King yesterday, and set out from hence this morning, on his return to *Flanders*. A Sum of 20000 Pistoles was sent this week to the Prince of *Hesse-Darmstadt* Vice-Roy of *Catalonia*; to Pay the Troops in that Province. The King has Declared the Cardinal de *Gindice* Protector of the Affairs of *Italy* at the Court of *Rome*; in the room of Cardinal *d' Aquirre* deceased. The Duke of *Medina-Celi* is made Counsellor of State. The Government of *Malaga* is given to Don *Fernando de Argote*. Don *Bernardino de Pinadas* Secretary to the Council of War, died some days ago. We have received an Account of the Duke of *Uceda's* arrival at *Barcelona*, where his Excellency and his Family would embark on board two Gallies of the Duke of *Turris's* Squadron, in order to proceed on his Embally to *Rome*. The French Ambassador is returned hither from *Morata* near *Toledo*, where he has been splendidly entertained by the Marquis of *Leganez*. They write from *Ceuta*, that the *Moor*: continue still the Siege of that place, notwithstanding the ill Success they have hitherto had in this Undertaking.

Turin, Octob. 31. The French Ambassador is returned from *Nice*, where he has been to view some Lands in Dispute between the Duke of *Savoy* and the Prince of *Monaco*, in order to give an Account thereof to the King his Master, whose Mediation is accepted by both Parties for the adjusting of this Affair. The Baron of *Guidobon* is arrived here with the Character of Envoy Extraordinary from the Elector of *Bavaria*, and had Audience of the Duke of *Savoy* on the 22d Instant; And on the 26th his Royal Highness gave Audience of Leave to the Count of *Porro*, whom the King of Spain sent with the Character of his Envoy Extraordinary, to Compliment him on the Birth of the Prince of *Piedmont*. The Count of *St. Thomas*, First Minister of State to the Duke of *Savoy*, is dangerously ill.

Warsaw, Nov. 4. The Cardinal Primate returned hither this week from *Lowitz*, as the Bishop of *Polsania*, the Sieur *Sezucca* Vice-Chancellor of *Lithuania*, and divers other Senators likewise did from the Country; And they have since begun their Conferences with the Baron *d'Overbeck* and Monsieur *Wernar*, Deputies from the Elector of *Brandenburgh*, in order to finish the Treaty for accommodating the Business of *Elbing*; To which end it's said, the Deputies of *Brandenburgh* have made some new Proposals. The Crown-Generall continues still at *Caminnic*, and has given the Necessary Orders for the marching of the Forces under his Command to their Winter-Quarters,

and for the providing of *Caminnic* with Artillery, Ammunition, and other Necessaries: Prince *Constantine*, one of the Sons of the late King of *Poland*, is now in *Silesia* with Prince *James* his Brother, and intends to go from thence to *Dresden*, and after a short stay there, will continue his Journey to *Rome*, to which Place he is going to pay a Visit to the Queen-Dowager, and to be present at the Jubilee.

Vienna, Nov. 7. The Emperor has demanded of the States of *Hungary* a Subsidy of 4 Millions of Livers, and that they provide besides Subsidy for the Imperial Regiments which are quartered at present in that Kingdom. The Meeting of the Imperial and *Turkish* Ambassadors on the Frontiers, is regulated in the following manner; Count *Guido* of *Staremberg*, Commander in Chief of the Imperial Forces in those Parts, is to receive the *Turkish* Ambassador near *Salankment* at the Head of 300 Horse; The Seraskier of *Belgrade* is in like manner to receive Count *Otting*, the Imperial Ambassador, at the Head of the same number of Spahis; and after having met and passed the proper Compliments, the Commissioners appointed on both sides are to conduct the Ambassadors on their Journeys, and defray their Expences. A Placet was published this week, to give notice that the Chamber of Accounts are willing to receive the Proposals of any Persons that will undertake to furnish the Magazines of *Vienna*, *Raab*, and *Cemorra*, with Ammunition and Provisions. Orders are sent likewise to the Commanders of the Imperial Troops in *Hungary* and *Transylvania*, to take care that the Magazines in those Provinces be well stored with Ammunition; And to hasten the Building of the new Fortifications near *Arat*, the Winter Season coming on, which will oblige the Troops that are employed therein, to discontinue that Work. Our Letters from *Belgrade* give an Account, that the *Turkish* Ambassador's Baggage was arrived there, and that he was expected in few days.

Francfort, Nov. 14. Monsieur *Mullern*, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of *Sueden*, left this Place on the 11th Instant, in order to go to *Nancy* to compliment the Duke and Duchess of *Lorraine* in the Name of the King his Master on the Birth of their Son. The Elector Palatine's Forces continue to work with great diligence in rebuilding the Fortifications of *Manheim*, and a great number of Workmen are likewise employed in repairing the Castle of *Hydelberg*, that it may be ready by the next Spring for the reception of his Electoral Highness, who intends to make it the Place of his constant Residence, and has given Orders to the Courts of Justice of the Palatinate, which are now kept at *Wynckim*, to remove thither next March. Our Letters from *Suitzerland* say, the Dutchess of *Nemours* had, at the Most Christian King's Desire, displaced Monsieur *Momin*, who Commanded at *Nous-Chatel*, and given the Government of that Place to one Monsieur *Molandin*.

Cologne, Nov 17. The Elector Palatine having stayed three days at *Coblenz*, where he and his whole

whole Court were entertained in a very splendid manner by the Elector of *Triers*, parted from thence yesterday, and passed this afternoon by this City towards *Düsseldorf*; His Electoral Highness was Complimented by the Magistrates of this City, and Saluted with a Discharge of the Cannon round the Town. Orders have been sent to the Inhabitants of the Duchies of *Bergh* and *Juliers* to furnish a certain quantity of Corn for the Subsistence of the Elector Palatine's Forces, in lieu of the Subsidies they were to pay. The Baron of *Borzelaar*, Envoy Extraordinary from the Elector of *Brandenburg*, arrived here the 14th Instant from *Frankfort*, and intends in few days to go to *Cleves*, and from thence to *Düsseldorf*, where it's said he is to make some Remonstrances to the Elector Palatine concerning the Hardships that are put upon his Protestant Subjects.

Hamburg, Nov. 17. The young Count of *Ravenslau* arrived here last Saturday from *Copenhagen*, and the same day continued his Journey to the Elector of *Brandenburg's* Court. It's said, he is sent thither to desire Passage through his Electoral Highness's Dominions for 8000 Men of the King of *Poland's* Saxon Forces, which the King of *Denmark* intends, if there be occasion, to take into his Service. They write from *Holstein*, that the Duke's Forces have provided such of their new Forts as are in a condition of Defence with good Garrisons, and with Artillery and Ammunition. In the Fort called the *Huffsummer Schans*, they have 8 Companies of Foot, 4 of *Suedes*, and 4 of *Holsteiners*; and in the Fort of *Schwabsted*, and the *Holmer Schans*, are like Garrisons of *Suedes* and *Holsteiners*. The *Suedes*, which arrived lately in *Pomerania* from *Carlskrona*, continue in their Quarters in the Neighbourhood of *Stessin*, and new Levies are making in that Country, in order to reinforce all the *Suedish* Regiments in those Parts with 300 Men each. The *Danes* at the same time continue to assemble their Troops near *Rensburg*, in order, as is believed, to attack the Forts lately built by the *Holsteiners*; But it's hoped this Matter will be amicably composed by the Mediation of several Princes, who do employ their good Offices to this effect. And there are Letters from the Duchy of *Holstein* which give an Account, that the Duke of *Holstein's* Forces had received Orders to leave off building their new Forts, and did accordingly discontinue that Work on the 11th Instant, which is said to be done in compliance to some Proposals that have been made by the Princes Mediators, containing among other things, That the building of the said Forts should immediately cease; That the King of *Sweden* should order his Troops to march out of *Holstein*; And that the King of *Denmark* should forbear attacking the Forts lately built in that Duchy for a certain time, during which a Treaty may be set on foot for adjusting this Matter. Our last Letters from *Copenhagen* say, the *Danish* Squadron of Men of War were still at Sea, and that a fortnight's Provisions had lately been sent them.

Hague, Nov. 20. N. S. The Deputies from the Colleges of the Admiralty are still here, and continue their Conferences with the Deputies of the States-General about their Maritime Affairs. Mr. *Stuyvesant* is arrived here from *Berlin*, where he has Resided with the Character of his Majesty of *Great-Britain's* Envoy Extraordinary to the Elector of *Brandenburg*, and will be going to *England* in few days. Monsieur *Palaisau*, Envoy from the Elector of *Brandenburg* to the King of *Spain*, parted from hence this week for *Madrid*. Monsieur *Mogere*, Commissioner from this State for settling the Trade between *Holland* and *France*, is shortly expected here from *Paris*. There is a Negotiation on foot for adjusting the Affair of *Holstein*.

Plimouth, Nov. 12. Yesterday sailed from hence the *George*, Tho. Blake Commander, and the *James*, Daniel Williams Master, both for *Virginia*; and the *Orange-Tree* of *Plimouth*, John Deeble Master, for *Bilboa*. The same day came into this Port the *Increase* of *Topsham*, Edm. Beard Master, bound home from *Bilboa*; and the *Expeditio* of *London*, James Taylor Master, bound to *Alicant*.

Bristol, Nov. 13. This day arrived here the *Martin Galley*, Syllus Wotton Commander, from *Malaga*; and the *Mary-Ann* from *Faro*. Divers outward-bound Merchant Ships are now in *Kings-Row*, waiting for a fair Wind.
