One night, this airman was engaged on a reconnaissance flight over the Benghazi area when he observed enemy fighters below him. Nevertheless, he decided to complete his mission. Whilst making his run over the harbour, his aircraft was damaged by antiaircraft fire and then attacked by Messerschmitt 109s. By skilful tactics, Sergeant Welshman finally evaded his attackers and eventually succeeded in flying his badly damaged aircraft safely back to his base. He secured valuable information.
