PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the Bishops Resignation Act, 1869, a representation has been made to His Majesty by the Most Reverend and Right Honourable Cosmo Gordon, by Divine Providence Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, Primate of All England and Metropolitan at the instance of the Right Reverend Bertram, by Divine Permission Lord Bishop of Norwich, and as such a Bishop of a Diocese within and of the Province of Canterbury, that the said Bishop is desirous of resigning his Bishopric (such resignation to take formal effect upon the 24th day of June, 1942), by reason that he is incapacitated by age from the due performance of his duties as Bishop;

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied of such incapacity and that the said Bishop has canonically resigned:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared that the said Bishopric of Norwich shall become vacant on the 24th day of June, 1942, and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased to direct, and it is hereby directed, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the Diocese of Norwich.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Burial Act, 1855, it was, amongst other things, enacted that it should be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, should or should not have arrived), as to His Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, might seem fit:

And whereas an Order in Council was made on the 24th day of February, 1938, directing the discontinuance of burials in the additional burial ground adjoining Marlborough Common provided in the year 1853 by the Ecclesiastical Parishes of St. Peter and St. Paul, St. Mary the Virgin, St. George (Preshute) and by the Marlborough Free Churches:

And whereas it seems fit to His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, that the said Order in Council of the 24th day of February, 1938, should be varied:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said Order shall have effect subject to the following exceptions or qualifications, viz.:—

(a) one more burial may be allowed in the following earthen graves now existing in the said burial ground provided it is possible to have three feet of soil on the top of the second coffin:—

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 26th day of March, 1942, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Westminster Abbey Measure, 1929, have prepared the following Scheme
