SOUTH SHIELDS CORPORATION (TROLLEY VEHICLES) ORDER, 1942.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 24th day of April, 1942, the Minister of War Transport made an Order that, subject to the conditions and restrictions specified therein, the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of South Shields—

(1) shall provide maintain and equip the trolley vehicle route in the Borough of South Shields hereunder described, namely—

A route (5 furlongs, 4 chains or thereabouts in length) commencing in Prince Edward Road by a junction with the existing trolley vehicle route, thence proceeding along Centenary Avenue and terminating at the junction of Centenary Avenue and Marsden Road, together with a turning point in Marsden Road at the termination of the said route.

(2) shall operate a service of trolley vehicles on the said route as part of their trolley vehicle undertaking, and shall in respect of the vehicles used on such service be exempt from any statutory obligations or restrictions from which they are exempt in respect of their trolley vehicle undertaking.
