Cadiz, Nov. 30. N. S.

AN English Man of War, commanded by Capt. *Trevanian*, will sail from hence in a day or two to fetch Capt. *Delavall* from *Tetuan*, who has made an Agreement with the Emperor of *Morocco* for the Redemption of the English Captives within his Dominions. Don *Françisco Miguel del Puyo*, late Governor of this Place, is gone from hence to *Madrid*, and the Conde d'Eril his Successor is arrived here.

Madrid, Dec. 3. The King of *Spain* has made Don *Joseph de Carrillo* Secretary of War, Don *Françisco Daza* Secretary of *Naples*, Don *Emanuel Vadilla* Secretary of *Sicily*, and Don *Juan Antonio Romeo* Secretary of *Milan*. Signior *Archinto*, the Pope's Nuncio, has received Advice by an Express from *Rome* of his being made a Cardinal, and has thereupon been Complimented by the Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Quality at Court. The Conde de *Monterey*, in pursuance of the Orders he received from the King of *Spain*, is retired to *Samara*, and it's believed the Marquis of *Leganez*, and several other Persons of Quality who are in the same Interest, will likewise be ordered to depart from the Court, and that the Almirante of *Castile* will be again received into the King's Favour.

Thrin, Dec. 7. The Count of *Briort*, who has for some time resided here as Ambassador from *France*, being appointed to go to *Holland* with the same Character, has had Audience of Leave of the Duke of *Savoy*, and intends to leave this place in 2 or 3 days in order to return to *Paris*, and from thence to repair to his Station at the *Hague*. Prince *Thomas of Lorrain*, only Son to the Prince of *Vaudemont*, came hither some days ago from *Milan*. The Marquis of *St. Thomas*, First Minister of State to the Duke of *Savoy*, has for some time been very ill of a languishing Sickness, of which it's believed he will hardly recover. Two Regiments of Dragoons that were in Garrison in this City are ordered to be dismounted, and to be put in Garrison at *Vercel*.

Warsaw, Dec. 1. The Palace here is fitting up for the King's reception, who is expected in a short time, but it's said, the Queen does not design to come hither till after the Conclusion of the General Diet, who are to meet about next *February*. Monsieur *Verre*, the *Brandenburgh* Resident, has acquainted the Cardinal Primate, that the Elector his Master does not accept the Offers made him on the part of this Republick; which are, That upon Condition his Electoral Highness would withdraw his Forces from *Elbing*, 300000 Dollars should be paid him in ready Money, and 100000 (which make up the Sum due to him according to what was Stipulated by the Treaties of *Veleu* and *Bigoff*) should be paid within a certain time, and a sufficient Mortgage put into his hands till he had received the same; But the Elector insists upon the Interest of this Money, which seeing it has been due above 40 Years, would amount to a vast Sum, and the Senate do not think themselves obliged to pay the same, it not being expressed in the above-mentioned Treaties, besides they are not without Pretensions on their side upon the Elector of *Brandenburgh*, so that this Affair is like to continue undecided till the King's return, and the Meeting of the next Diet. Prince *Alexander Sobieski* having recovered his Health, is gone from hence to *Olau* in *Silesia* to meet Prince *Constantine* his Brother, and from

thence they will continue their Journey together to *Rome*. The Crown-Generall who came hither some days ago from *Lemberg*, is gone to *Cracow*, where the General Officers are to have a Meeting, in order to settle the Accounts of the Army.

Copenhagen, Dec. 12. On the 10th of this Month the Queen of *Denmark* (to the great Joy of the whole Court) was brought to Bed of a Prince, who was Christned the same day, and named *Christian*. The new Levies are continued, and the King has given Orders for providing Magazines of Provisions and Ammunition; And to support these Expences, a Poll-Tax is laid on all the King's Subjects, as likewise a Duty upon Cattel.

Vienna, Dec. 9. The Queen of the *Romans* was safely delivered yesterday of a Princess, who was Christned this afternoon; whereupon the Mourning which the Court is in for the Queen of *Portugal* has been laid aside for two days. Prince *Esterhazy* Palatine of *Hungary*, and the Deputies from the States of that Kingdom and Principality of *Transylvania*, are still here, to settle Matters relating to the Subsidies they are to give for the next year, and about the Quarters for the Imperial Troops in those Countries. Count of *Lemberg*, Ambassador from the Emperor to the Pope, will begin his Journey to *Rome* in a day or two; and the Cardinal *Santa Croce*, who resided here as the Pope's Nuncio, is likewise on his departure thither. Our Letters from *Hungary* give an Account, that Count *Ossing*, the Emperor's Ambassador to the Grand Signior, went on the 30th Instant from *Ferack* to *Peterwaradin*, and that the Turkish Ambassador arrived the same day at *Belgrade*; so that we may expect by our next Letters from thence, to receive an Account of their having met on the Frontiers.

Dresden, Dec. 7. The States of *Saxony* continue still assembled, but it's believed they will end their Sessions in few days. The Duke of *Saxe-Weissenfels* is come hither from *Weissenfels*. Major-Generall *Blüming* is returned hither from *Berlin*, and has given the King of *Poland* an Account of his Negotiations at that Court. The Elector of *Brandenburgh* continuing in his Resolution, not to permit the *Saxon* Forces which the King of *Denmark* intends to take into his Service to pass through his Territories, it has been resolved to find them to *Dantzick*, and from thence by Sea to *Denmark*. The greatest part of the King's Servants are set out from hence on their return to *Warsaw*, and those who are to attend him in his Journey have Orders to be in a readiness for their departure, his Intents being to leave this place in few days. The young Count of *Ravenhau* designs to be going from hence in a day or two for *Copenhagen*.

Hamburgh, December 18. Major General *Jordan*, Envoy from the King of *Poland* to the *French* Court, set out from hence this week on his Journey to *France*; He has had several Conferences with the Deputies of our Senate, in order to procure the Admission of the *Sieur Wigand* as Resident from the King of *Poland* in this City, but the Senate having some personal Exceptions against him, cannot be prevailed with to acknowledge him as such. The *Sieur Blome* one of the King of *Denmark*'s Council of State, is come hither from *Copenhagen*, to assist at the Conferences for adjusting the Affair of *Holsheim*; 'Tis said, that the Ministers of that Crown and those of the Duke of *Holsheim*, insisting so much on their own Terms, that it appears very difficult to bring them to any preliminary Agreement in order to begin this Negotiation, the Mediators have themselves drawn up a Project of several Articles to that effect, which they have caused to be presented to both Parties, with a Declaration, that those who refuse to comply therewith, shall be looked upon to be the Aggressors, which are as follows; That a certain Term shall be agreed upon, in which this Treaty shall be negotiated and concluded, and that during this time the new Forts shall continue as they are at present, the *Suedish* Forces shall retire out of the Dutchy of *Holsheim*, and the *Danes* shall engage not to attack the said Forts, nor to oppress the Duke of *Holsheim*'s Subjects, by quartering Soldiers upon them. In the said time, we hear the Duke of *Wurtemberg* continues to take a Review

of the Danish Forces in the Duchy of Holstein; And that on the other hand, the Count of Guldenstern, Governour of Sweden, is appointed to Command the Duke of Holstein's Forces and the Swedish Forces in Holstein, and has given Directions that they be in a readiness to march upon the first Notice. Some Companies of the King of Denmark's Forces having taken Quarters in the Neighbourhood of this Place, the Senate have ordered the Guards of this City to be doubled, and one of the Gares called the *Dampart*, which is nearest to their Quarters, to be constantly kept shut. 'Tis reported here, that the King of Denmark will set out to-morrow from Copenhagen on his Journey to Holstein; and that 7000 Men of the Troops of Lueuburg have Orders to join and assist the Swedes and Holsteiners, in case the Danes do Attack them.

Hague, Dec. 22. N.S. The States of Holland and West-Friseland will adjourn to-morrow or Thursday next till after the Christmas Holidays. It's said, Don Quiros, the Spanish Ambassador, who went some day ago to Brussels, will return hither in a short time.

Plimouth, Dec. 12. Yesterday came in here the Bilbao Factor of London, William Trump Master, from St. Sebastians, and the Rebecca of London, Thomas Mills Master, from Lubon. The Thomas and John of Margate, Edw. Mourton Master, is put into this Port, being bound to St. Sebastians, and the Lawson of Rotterdam, Peter Ayme Master, bound to Cadiz.

Deale, Dec. 15. On the 12th and 13th Instant came into the Downs the Unity, Capt. Womacor Commander, from the Canaries; the William and Thomas, Capt. Long, and the Greyhound, Capt. Buckeley, from Alicant; and the Unity Ketch, Capt. Franklin, from St. Sebastians. There are at present in the Downs the Eaton Frigate, Capt. Philips Commander, the Howland, Capt. Pruett, and the Fame, Captain Browne, bound to the East Indies; the Happy Return, Capt. Bruffer, for Guinea, and about 18 or 20 other outward-bound Merchant Ships, which will proceed on their several Voyages with the first fair Wind.
