Cadiz, Nov. 30. N. S.

N English Man of War, commanded by Capt. Trevanian, will fail from hence in a day or two to fetch Capt. Delavall from Tetuan, who has made an Agreement with the Emperor of Maracco for the Redemption of the English Captives within his Dominions. Don Franeifa Miguel del Pueyo, late Governor of this Place, is gone from hence to Madrid, and the Conde d'Eril

is gone from nence to Maaria, and the Conde d'Eril his Successor is arrived here.

Madrid, Dec. 3. The King of Spain has made Don Jaseph de Carillo Secretary of War, Don Francisco Data Secretary of Naples, Don Emanuel Vadilla Secretary of Sicily, and Don Jaan Antonio Romea Secretary of Milan. Signior Archinto, the Pope's Number has received Advice by an Express from Nuncio, has received Advice by an Express from Rome of his being made a Cardinal, and has thereupon been Complimented by the Foreign Minifless, and other Persons of Quality at Court. The Conde de Monterey, in pursuance of the Orders he received from the King of Spain, is retired to samera, and it's believed the Marquis of Leganez, and feveral other Perfons of Quality who are in the same Interest, will likewise be ordered to depart from the Court, and that the Almirante of Cafile will be again received into the King's

Twin, Dec. 7. The Count of Briors, who has for some time resided here as Ambassador from France, being appointed to go to Holland with the same Character, has had Audience of Leave of the Duke of Sawy, and intends to leave this place in 2 or 3 days in order to return to Paris, and from thence to repair to his Station at the Hague. Prince Thomas of Lorrain, only Son to the Prince of Vaudemont, came hither fome days ago from Milan. The Marquis of St. Thomas, First Minifier of State to the Duke of Savoy, has for some time been very ill of a languishing Sickness, of which it's believed he will hardly recover. Two Regiments of Dragoons that were in Garrison in this City are ordered to be dismounted, and to be

put in Garrison at Verceil.

Wasaw, Dec. 1. The Palace here is sitting up for the King's reception, who is expected in a short time, but it's said, the Queen does not detign to come hither till after the Conclusion of the General Diet, who are to meet about next February. Monsieur Werner, the Brandenburgh Resident, has acquainted the Cardinal Primate, that the Elector his Master does not accept the Offers made him on the part of this Republick; which are, That upon Condition his Vectoral Hachness would withdraw his Forces from Elbing, 300000 Dollars should be paid him in ready Menoy, and 100000 (which m ke up the Sum due to him according to what was Sripulated by the Treaties of Velau and Bidoss') should be paid within a certain time, and a sufficient Mortgage put into his haads till no had received the same; Rut the Elector insists upon the Interest of this Money, which seeing it has been due above at Yeas, would amount to a vast Sum, and the Seitate do not think themselves obliged to pay the same, it not being expected in the above-mentioned Treaties, besides they are not without Pretentions on their side upon the Elector of Brandenburgh, so that this Affairis like to continue undecided til the King's return, and the Meeting of the next Dier. Prince Alexander Sobieski having recovered his Itealch, is gone from hence to Olau in sulfis to meet Prince Confaurine his Brother, and from

thence they will continue their Journey together to Rome. The Crown-General who came hither fome days ago from Lemberg, is gone to Cracow, where the General Officers are to mave a Meeting, in order to fittle the Accounts of

the Army.

Copenhagen, Dec. 12. On the toth of this Month the Queen of Denmark (to the great Joy of the whole Court) was brought to Bed of a Prince, who was Christned the Iame day, and named Christian. The new Levies are continued, and the King has given Olders for providing Magazines of Provisions and Ammunition; And to support these Expences, a Poll-Tax is laid on all the King's Subjects, as likewise a Duty upon Cattel.

Piena, Dec. 9. The Queen of the Romans was safely delivered yesterday of a Princes, who was Christned this afternoon; whereupon the Mourning which the Court is in for the Queen of Portugal has been laid aside for two days. Prince Esterbass Palatine of Hungary, and the Deputies from the States of that Kingdom and Principality of Transituania, are still here, to settle Matters reliting to the Subsidies they are to give for the next year, and about the Quarters for the Imperial Troops in those Countries. Count of Lemberg, Ambassader from the Emperor to the Pope, will begin his Journey to Rame in a day or two; and the Cardinal Sansa Grece, who resided here as the Pope's Nuncio, is likewise on his departure thicher. Our Letters from Eurgary give an Account, that Countoffing, the Emperor's Ambassador to the Grand Signior, went on the 30th Instant from Fatack to Petermarading and that the Turkish Ambassador arrived the same day at Belgrade; to that we may expect by our ne t Letters from thence, to receive an Account of their having met on the Fiontiers.
