Application for an Order under Section 1 of the Gas Undertakings Act, 1929.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Ormskirk District Gas Company (hereinafter referred to as "the Company") whose principal office is at 62-64 Aughton Street Ormskirk intend to apply to the Board of Trade for an Order under Section 1 of the Gas Undertakings Act, 1929, for the following among other purposes, that is to say:—

1. To authorise the Company to raise additional capital by the creation and issue of

(a) New Ordinary Shares or Stock or New Preference Shares or Stock Capital to an amount not exceeding £28,000 in addition to any Capital which the Company are authorised to raise under the Ormskirk Gas Acts and Orders, 1853 to 1941.

(b) To authorise the Company to borrow on mortgage of their Undertaking or to raise by the creation and issue of Debenture Stock any sum or sums not exceeding in the whole (when added to any money so borrowed or raised and outstanding at the date or respective dates on which the Company exercise such powers) 90 per centum of the aggregate amount of the paid up Share Capital of the Company for the time being and of any premiums paid in respect thereof.

2. To modify the provisions of Section VI of the Ormskirk Gaslight Act, 1853, Section 13 of the Ormskirk Gaslight Act, 1892, Section 42 of the Ormskirk Gas and Electricity Act, 1915, and Section 2 of the Ormskirk District Gas (Capital Powers) Order, 1941, so as to authorise the Company to raise the said additional Capital and so far as may be necessary in order to give full effect to the proposed Order to incorporate or apply with or without modification or to repeal alter or amend any other provisions of the Ormskirk Gas Acts and Orders, 1853 to 1941, or any of the provisions of the Companies Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, and the Companies Clauses Act, 1863, or any other Act or Order.

3 Any Local or Public Authority Company or person desiring to bring before the Board of Trade any objection to the Application may do so by registered letter addressed to the Assistant Secretary, Industries and Manufacture Department, New Oxford House, Bloomsbury Way, London, W.C.1, and despatched on or before the 27th day of June, 1942.
