A PROCLAMATION.

FOR CONTINUING IN ACTUAL SERVICE CERTAIN OFFICERS AND MEN OF THE NAVAL RESERVES.

GEORGE R.I.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on Us by section five of the Royal Naval Reserve Volunteer Act, 1859, as amended by subsequent enactments, and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, We hereby order and direct that all men of the Royal Naval Reserve and Royal Fleet Reserve, all officers and men of the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve (including the Royal Naval Volunteer (Wireless) Reserve) and all men of the Royal Naval Special Reserve, who at the date of this Our Proclamation are in actual service shall continue in such actual service for the period of five years from the date of their respectively coming into actual service, if their services be so long required.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this eleventh day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and forty-two and in the Sixth year of Our Reign.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 4th day of June, 1942, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the Parishes of Sundon and Streatley and of the New Parish of Biscot all in the County of Bedford and in the Diocese of Saint Albans:

"Whereas it appears to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to be desirable that the boundaries of the said Parishes and New Parish should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Bishop of the Diocese and the Incumbents of the Benefices concerned consent to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof they have signed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said

Parishes of Sundon and Streatley and of the said New Parish of Biscot shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedules of and delineated on the map or plan annexed to this Scheme.

"The Schedules to which the foregoing Scheme has reference:—

"The First Schedule.

"The territory (shown by pink colour on the map) to be annexed to the parish of Sundon:—

"All that portion of the New Parish of Biscot in the County of Bedford and in the Diocese of Saint Albans which is bounded on the north by the said Parish of Sundon on part of the west by the Parish of Toddington in the said County and Diocese and on the remaining part of the west, upon the south and upon the east by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Toddington from the said New Parish of Biscot crosses the middle of the London Midland and Scottish Railway and extending thence south-eastwards along the middle of the railway for a distance of 22 chains or thereabouts to the middle of the Sundon Arch and extending thence north-eastward (thereby crossing Whitefield Road) to and along the middle of the stream which forms the northern boundary of Legrave Common for a distance in all of 12 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite the western end of the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of Rotten Corner and extending thence eastward to and along the said wall or fence to its eastern end and in a straight line in continuation thereof for a distance in all of 39 chains or thereabouts to the middle of the footpath leading to Great Bramingham Farm and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of 50 chains or thereabouts to the south-eastern end of the wall or fence forming the north-eastern boundary of Great Bramingham Wood and extending thence north-westward along the said wall or fence for a distance of 27 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the wall or fence forming the boundary between the closes numbered 1 and 2 on the map annexed to this Scheme and extending thence first north-eastward, then north-westward and then again north-eastward along the said wall or fence for a distance in all of 18 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite the southern end of the wall or fence forming the boundary between the closes numbered 3 and 4 on the said map and extending thence north-westward to and along the last-mentioned wall or fence and along the wall or fence forming the boundary between the closes numbered 5 and 4 upon the same map for a distance of 29 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Biscot from the said Parish of Sundon.

"The Second Schedule.

"The territory (shown by green colour on the map) to be annexed to the Parish of Streatley:—

"All that portion of the said New Parish of Biscot which is bounded upon the east by the New
