lies is lately departed hence with Order to fit up his squadron, and his believed he may be employ'd 'in the service for the assistance of the Venetians, being an able soldier and good seaman of which he has given sufficient proof on

many occahons.

Vienna, April 6. The Empetours forces are according to their Orders marching into Hungary to secure those parts against any designs the Turks may have upon them, and to preserve the peace of the Kingdom, and keep the people under their ancient Government, several Arts having been lately used to alienate them from their obedience, insomuch as some of them have been persuaded to seek for the protection of the Turks; and to avoid all farther disputes, and compose those already risen amongst the persons of several persuasions and Interests, His Imperial Maiesty has ordered the Count de Rathal, with his principal Secretary of State of stungary to hear and determine all such controverfies.

The Levies granted to the Pope for the relief of Candia are well advanced, we have some apprehensions of diffurbances in Hungary, especially since the report so much spread abroad that the Turks intend to diposless Prince Michael Abassi of his principality, and that they continue in their delign after they have taken a view of their forces in Hungary to match them through a part of the Christian

Territories into Dalmatia.

The Count de Schafgotz is fitting up his Train and making extraordinary preparations for his Embassic into Polund, to be present at the General Diet and the Election

of their new King, his Instructions being now forming and may in few days be perfected.

Yesterday arrived here a Courier from the Court of Spain, who was some time since sent thisher with the news of the safe delivery of the Empress, bringing with him the Queen Regents Compliments, and a Present for the young Princess of a Jewel to the value of so thousand Rixdollars,

Venice, April 6. Here is now ready in this Porta Conyoy of many thips laden with all forts of Provisions and Ammunition, whereon are also embarked many Soldiers, Gunners, Chirurgeons, and Lahourers to be employed at the Works and Mines; which may fee fail with the first fire wind for the Levans.

On Saturiar last an able Sanator was chosen to command it, Seguior Piero Diedo, a person formerly employ'd in the Levinto, as Captain of the ships in the Armata, and at the same time the Noble Giggoma Corners was also cho-

fen Proyedings General of the Armata.

By everal Letters from the Levant we are informed that the Grand Seguior who still continues at Lariffa having begn often pressed by the Visier for a strong succour, withour which he was not able to give that account of the fiege of Candia as might be expected from him, had commanded the Balla of Morea to take tare that all the forces which be had drawn together in those parts might be speedily umbarked and transported into the Kingdom of Candia; in obedience whereunto, he had prefled many Saichs ar Lepanto, which took aboard them the faid Milicia with the provisions mecessary for the supply of the Visier, and put to les under the protection of leveral Galeots, intending for Canes, but had not made many Leagues at less when a great storm surprising them, dispersed the Convoy, of which 5 Saichs and 4 Galeots were known to be overfet or caft away, nor had they any account of the rest.

They farther say, that the Visser being in hopes of a speedy resinforcement, continued his Warks and Mines with all imaginable diligence, in which his people receive frequent disturbances from the beseged, and by Countermines and Sillies are much lessend asheir numbers and courage, and that they have lately began to raise about the Monaftery di Santo Spirito near the Bulwark St. Andrea high Mount or Platform, upon which they intend to plant many Great Guns, and by their constant plying them upon the Town to disturb the besieged in their new Works, which they are raising within the Old, that the Turks might there find an on proyment when by their Mines they shall have

ruined and gained, or made unferviceable the other.

They forther confirm to us the new ather. Segnior Moral mit Captain of the Fleet had lately taken (everal small ships mon the Turks, which were laded the Good, Cloaths and Men intended for Canea: and the thy. Mine lately sprung by the besieged near the Bulwark St. Andre, they had blown up many Turks with their Ladders into the Air, and lest a great Terror amongst the rest.

The Brunswick forces 'tis believed may be by this well advanced on their voyage, though for fix days after their putting our to leathey met with contrary winds, which

for that time detained them.

Paris. April 17. Letters from Smirna arriving here by the way of Marfeilles advise us, that the Sieur de la Hay, our Ambassadour lasely at Constantinople was departed thence, and instead of returning homewards went to attend the Grand Segrisor at Larissa, where he waveceing wed at the Court with all the tonour and respect which he could defire from him, with a promise of full satisfactly on to all his just complaints; for encouragement whereof the these sistifications of the Court 5 at his Audience the Carand Segnion is said to have Treated him with Excellency, and given him several marks of esteems, projecting his defire to entertain a good correspondency with His most Christian Marjesty, and that he has done his endeavour to take away all occasions of a breach with France.

Hague, April 18. Yesterday the States of Holland adejourned themselves till the 7th of the next Monethi having not after many conferences concluded any thing with the Deputies from Zealand, in the mean time the faid Deputies continue their Negotiations with the Commissioners appointed for that purpose, in which they spend anatch time.

Other Commissioners are nominated and appointed to confert with the Baron d'Helder, Envoye from the Prince of Liege about his pretensions to the Castle de la Rechete in the Countrey on the other side the Meuse. Tis said the States are resolved to write to the Count de Beathers to press him to admit of a Reconciliation with his Wife, to whom at present they allow an honourable Pension side support of her self and Children.

London, April 14.
