Permits the movement of animals, under licence, out of the Infected Area around Membury, Honiton, Devon, direct to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse in the Infected Area around Morebath, Devon.

Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Special Order No. 30 of 1942.

Subject.

I. Contracts the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area around Llandudno, Caernarvon, on 13th July, 1942, to an area comprising the districts situate within approximately 5 miles of Llandudno.

II. Releases such contracted Infected Area from restrictions on 20th July, 1942.

Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Special Order No. 31 of 1942.

Subject.

Declares an area comprising the districts situate within approximately 15 miles of Wymondham, Norfolk, to be an Infected Area for the purpose of preventing the spreading of foot-and-mouth disease, to which area the provisions of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1938 are applied. The area subject to restrictions lies in the counties of Norfolk and East Suffolk.

WAR DAMAGE ACT, 1941.

SECTION 7.

The War Damage Commission hereby give notice that they have, for the purpose of giving effect to directions given by the Treasury under sub-section (1) of section 7 of the War Damage Act, 1941, and under the power conferred upon them by sub-section (2) of the said section, specified the two following areas in the County Borough of Sunderland:—

(b) Area No. 2 comprised by the hereditaments known as:—

- Nos. 1 to 6 (inclusive), Tavistock House, Borough Road.
- Nos. 1 to 7 (inclusive), Victoria Chambers, Laura Street (including Oddfellows' Hall).
- Nos. 1 to 12 (inclusive), Murton Street.
- No. 12, Murton Street (back).
- Nos. 1 to 22 (inclusive), Tavistock Place.
- Nos. 14 and 15, Tavistock Place (back).

A plan of the said area has been deposited and may be inspected at the Town Hall, Sunderland.

The War Damage Commission also give notice that they, under the power conferred upon them by the aforementioned sub-section, impose on any person, who proposes to execute for making good war damage any works (other than temporary works) in the above specified areas, an obligation to inform the War Damage Commission of the proposal, and thereafter to furnish to them such particulars of the proposed works as they may require in any particular case.

In this notice a "hereditament" means either a hereditament as appearing in the rating valuation list; or, in the case of a hereditament which is exempt from rating and does not appear in that list, the hereditament so exempted, provided that where there is more than one occupation of a single building, the hereditament shall be the building.
