During an engagement over Loiwing, he shot down an enemy aircraft which was closing in on one of his fellow pilots. Sergeant Barrick himself was attacked by 2 fighters. During the combat his engine failed and he was compelled to make a landing. Although almost blinded by oil he succeeded in his purpose without the assistance of flaps. The enemy continued to fire at him whilst he was on the ground. Although suffering from shrapnel splinters and the effects of hot oil on his face, chest and arms. Sergeant Barrick walked for some 2 hours until he reached some Chinese troops. Throughout, he displayed great courage and fortitude. He has destroyed 5 enemy aircraft.

Sergeant Williams was captain of an aircraft detailed to attack Bremen one night in July, 1942. The objective was successfully bombed but, while still over the target area, his aircraft sustained damage. The port engine, hydraulics and flaps were put out of action. Height was lost from 10,000 ft. to 4,000 ft. before Sergeant Williams was able to regain control of the aircraft. Despite all his efforts, height could not be maintained, and in taking the necessary avoidcraft. This airman displayed great courage and determination throughout this hazardous experience. He has completed numerous sorties, and has displayed these high qualities throughout.
