**T**HE Letters from Madrid of the 30th past, give an account of the Death of the Marquis de los Balbases on the 29th, and that the King has appointed Don Gaspar de Zuniga to succeed the Marquis d' Astorga as Vice-Roy of this Kingdom of Galicia. They write from Oporto, that on the 2d Instant came in there four English Merchant Ships from London.

Warsaw, Dec. 31. The Ratifications of the Treaty lately concluded here between the King of Poland and the Elector of Brandenburg for accommodating the Affair of Elbing, are daily expected from Saxony, where the King is at present, and from Berlin, in order to be exchanged; The said Treaty being very well approved, both by the King, and by his Electoral Highness. The Cardinal Primate went from hence on the 27th Instant to Lowitz, where he intends to continue till the King's return, who is expected here about the latter end of the next Month. The Sieur Lezinsky, General of Great Poland, set out from this place the 25th past on his Embassy to the Port. The Crown-General continues at Radom, where the General Officers are met to settle the Accounts of the Army, in which they have made a good Progress. Our last Advices from Camniec say, the Garrison there are plentifully supplied with Provisions by the Inhabitants of the neighbouring Country, and particularly by the People of Moldavia, who have now renewed their Trade with the Polanders. The Governor of Camniec is coming hither, to give an Account to the Senate at their next Meeting of the Condition of the Fortifications of that Place, and to solicit the necessary Sums of Money to be employed in repairing and improving them.

Vienna, Jan. 2. The Arch-Duke Charles continues as well as can be expected in his condition, it being Niae days since the Small-Pox came out very kindly. An Express was sent this week to Count Marfeldt the Emperor's Commissioner for settling the Limits with the Turks in Croatia, with the last Resolution of this Court concerning the Town of Novi and its Dependencies, which is, That if the Turks do insist upon the demolishing of that Place, the Emperor is willing to consent thereunto, provided he may be at liberty to build another Fortress not far from thence for the Security of his Frontiers, and that all that part of the Territory of Novi which lies on this side the River Uina, be left to the Imperialists; which Proposal 'tis thought the Turks will comply with. Count Guido of Sarcenberg returned hither the 31st past from Hungary. The Turkish Ambassador continues his Journey to this Place, and is expected here in 10 or 12 days; He has with him a Train of 500 Persons, who are all detained at the Emperor's charge. The Count de Zaslavsky, Envoy from the Emperor to the King of Poland, is come hither from Warsaw, but will return to his Station in few days. Cardinal Santa Croce, Nuncio from the Pope, took his Audience of Leave of the Emperor on the 31st past, and intends in a day or two to set out from hence

on his return to Rome. The Count of Wallenstein, Envoy Extraordinary from the Emperor to the Court of Portugal, begun his Journey thither yesterday. The Count of Lewenstein went from hence yesterday for Frankfurt, where he is to reside as the Emperor's Commissioner, and to assist at the Conferences for settling the Dutchess of Orleans Pretensions on the Palatinate. The Bishop of Lerida, Ambassador from Spain, having taken his Leave of the Persons of Quality at this Court, is now on his departure for Madrid.

Dresden, Jan. 4. The King of Poland continues at Torgau, and intends in 5 or 6 days to go from thence to Leipsick, and to return hither about a fortnight hence, by which time 'tis supposed the States of Saxony, who are still assembled, will have finished the Business before them, and in three weeks the King will begin his Journey to Warsaw. Monsieur d'Opdam, Envoy Extraordinary from the States-General, had Audience of Leave of the King of Poland on the 31st past, and will return to Berlin in few days.

Frankfort, Jan. 10. A great number of Boats laden with Provisions are come hither from the Electorate of Mentz and the Bishoprick of Wurzburg, for the Service of the Imperial Garrisons of Philipsbourg, Fribourg, and the Fort of Kiehl. The Count of Roynembourg, the Emperor's Envoy, went from hence some days ago to Aschaffembourg, to confer with the Elector of Mentz, and is expected here again in a day or two in his return to Vienna; The Count of Lewenstein is coming hither in his room, and the Conferences for settling the Dutchess of Orleans Pretensions, at which he is to assist on the Emperor's part, are put off till his arrival.

Hamburg, Jan. 12. The Affairs of Holstein continue in the same condition, the Danes seem to wait only for the Weather's changing to a Frost to attack the Duke of Holstein's new Forts, and the Suedes appear resolved in such case to assist the Holsteiners. 'Twas reported 3 or 4 days ago, that some of the Suedish Regiments quartered in the Duchy of Bremen were on their march to Holstein, whereupon the Danish Officers in Holstein immediately drew together a good Body of Horse, and sent out strong Parties to secure the Passes; But this proving to be a groundless Report, the said Troops are returned to their Quarters. The Duke of Wirtemberg has left this place, and is now reviewing the Danish Forces in the neighbourhood of Pirmenberg. The Danish Ministers that were here to assist at the Conferences for adjusting the Affair of Holstein, are gone for some days to Termingen. Our Letters from Hanouer say, the Duke of Cell was come thither to visit the Elector of Hanouer.

Hague, Jan. 15. The Sieur Mollo, Resident from the King of Poland, has notified to the States-General, that a Treaty is concluded between the King his Master and the Elector of Brandenburg for accommodating the Business of Elbing. The Sieur Ancomowicz, Ambassador from the Czar of Muscovy to the States-General, has sent a Letter to them to acquaint them with his being on his way hither, and the States-General
