At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 6th day of August, 1942.

PRESENT,

The KING'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 29th day of July, 1942 (C.W.10237/42), in the words following, viz.:

"Whereas by Section 5 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that Your Majesty may, from time to time, by Your Order in Council, appoint such pensions as seem fit to Officers of the Royal Navy and Marines and others for the time being entitled to the benefits of Greenwich Hospital:

"And whereas Order in Council of 16th of January, 1924, sanctioned the re-allocation of Greenwich Hospital Pensions to Naval and Marine Officers on the Retired Lists of Your Majesty's Fleet as laid down in the Schedule annexed thereto:

"And whereas Clause 5 of the said Schedule provides that in the event of an officer being selected for a Greenwich Hospital Pension, who has retired from the Lieutenants' List, or the List of Officers of equivalent rank in the Engineer, Medical, Accountant or Instructor Branches, the rate of pension shall be £40 instead of £50:

"And whereas we consider it desirable that the sum provided for these pensions should be utilised to the fullest extent, and that there is no longer good reason for debarring these officers from receiving the full pension of £50:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to annul the said Clause 5 of the Schedule to Order in Council of 16th January, 1924."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly,
