the French have given order to their Receivers to bring in what Moneys they have received upon confilcation of the Effaces of fuch performs as live from their faid Effaces under the Spanish jurildiction and fervice.

The Veedor General and the Prefident of Flanders are this week gone f + spain.

The Duke of Neubourg has given order to all his Nobility to prepare themfelves to follow him in an handlomeequipage it a voyage he intends to make towards Poland.

On Saturday the infolency of fome Spanish Soldiers in affronting fome Citizens, a ccafion'd a tumult in one quarter of the City, which might have occafion'd much mifchief, had it not been timely compo ed by the Officers and Magificates.

Bruffels, April 19. The daily advices we receive of the reinforcement of most of the French Garillons, and the diligence they use in fortifying loweral places of their late Conquests, keep us upon our Guard, and oblige us likewile to take cire for the facurity of our Frontiet Towns, and fuch as may lie nearest danger, and particularly to reinforce the Garillons of Aix, St. Omers, Ipre, Dixmuid, with Neuport and Oftend, and many Waggons are ordered to be laden with Ammunition for the fupply of fuct places as may frand in need.

The High-ways are grown fontewhat better fecured than formerly, good Guards being every where employ'd, and fuch foldiers as are taken committing any Robberies, are immediately executed.

Paris, April 19. The Alby of St. Germains which was vacated and fell into the di posal of His most Christian Majefty upon the late Marriage of the Duke de Vernueil, has been by His Majesty conferred on King Casimir for his more honourable maintenance since his resignation of the Crown of Poland.

The Brince of Conde is much concerned at a Libel karely publishe in Folandy pretending to do right to the Duke of Neuburg as to his pretensions to that Crown, but in fome places falling too feverely upon him the Prince of Conde and his-fon.

The 12th inftants the Prince of D. nmark was introduced by the Sieur Bonnevil, to take his leave of both their Majefties, and on Tuesday kilt departed hence well fatisfied with the honourable Reception he found in this Court.

From Chartres we are told, that the River of Eure having for feveral years been ftopped up, but lately by the induftry of the Sieur Colbert made Navigable as far as Mogent le-Roy; on the 6th inffant, three great Velfels laden with Corn paffing out of that Port, the Great Guns were difcharged with fome Volle's of fhor; the people by their acclamations te ftifying their joy for the hope's they have of the refloration of their Trade.

The Sieur de la Hay our Amballadour, has written from Lariffa, that he is affured by that Court that the French Merchants shall for the future be admitted to Trade into the Levans, upon the fame tearns as those of other Nations, and thas all extraordinary Impositions on them shall be taken off, and that the Grand Segnior is willing to keep a good correspondency with the Crown of Frazee. This norwithstanding, our preparations are shill advancing for the fuccour of Candia 5 but for Thoulon we are informed, that the Fleet cannot be in readiness to put to sea fore the end of the next Moneth, by reason of the difficulty of Aoring it with Victuals furficient for the geople that are feat on board for 6 Moneths.

Father Nithard, the Spanish Inquistor-General, was in his pallage by Bayonne treated there by the Count de Guisbe with all possible civility, according to Mis Majeslies directions.

From Madrid we are rold, that Don Juan has dismissed his Officers and Soldiers, and de'ivered them to be provided for by the General of the Horle, who had disposed of shem into Quarters; and that the Commissioners appointed to compose all matters for his facisfaction, and the ease of the people, have had several conferences, and that Don Juan infiles much upon the calling to account fuch perfons as have been publick Receivers, and for the reprenchment of the extraordinary Fees and allowances of inany publick Ministers.

Earis, April 24. Upon the frequent inftances and applications of the Marquis de Villars in the Court of Spains, the Queen Regent has at the laft fent hither to His Marfefty the Letter which the wrote to the Conftable of Cafille, by which he is ordered to suppress the Offices for imposing Taxes and Customs upon such Merchandikes-as pals into or come from any of the Towns of our late Conquefts in the Netherlands, which His Majefty on Friday laft lent away by an Express with other Letters of Compliment to the Conftable of Cafille.

On Saturday last arrived here a Courier Extraordinary from the Pope with a Letter written by His Holineffes own hand to His Majefty, as likewile with instructions to his Nuncio, preffing the revocation of the Decree of the Council made against the pretended priviledges of the Religious.

Letters of the 3 inflant from Madrid affure us, that the young King is perfectly reftored to his health, and luch as defire it are without feruple admitted to fee him. That, Don Juan is yet at Guadalaxara, and that fince the late agreement made with him, all things continue peaceable and quiet.

Fother Nithard having taken his refolution to pais by Lyons intending for Italy. His Majefly has given Order for his honourable reception and entertainment in the City, and that he be Treated with the Title of his Excellency.

From Marfeilles, Letters of the 9th inftant inform us, that the Count de Vivonne is lately returned from the coafts of Barbary with the fquadron under his Command, having had fatisfaction on his demands from the Corfairs of Algiers and Tunis, who have promifed to observe punctually the late Treaties made with them, and to comply with what His most Christian Majesty shall reasonanbly define from them.

From Nancy we are advited, that the Duke of Lorrain had laid an extraordinary Taxe upon his Subjects for the raifing a large fumme of Moneys to be fent to Prince Charles his Nephew, to encourage his presentions to the Crown of Poland; but upon their great complaints of the impoverifit condition of his Countrey, which rendred them unable to fupply him with fuch fummes as were requised from them, the Duke has been pleafed to take off the Taxes, and to fupply the young Prince from fome other flock.

Prince Francis has upon le cond thoughts comply'd with the Duke in figning the Contract of the Prince de Vaudemonts marriage, and has great hopes of the loccels of the Prince his fon in the approaching Election to the Crown of Poland.

Portfmoush, April 15. Several thips are here fitting up. The Nonefuch is riding at Spitthead. Here is lately put in the Arms of London, Captain Godfrey Commander, having in Holland laden Corn bound for Genoua, but having forung a Leak was forced to make this place, and may in little time put out again to fea in pursuance of her voyage.
