Cadix, Jan. 4. N. S.

THE Lyme Man of War commanded by Captain *Trevanian*, arrived here the 25th of the last Month from *Tetuan*; He brought with him a *Moorish* Collonel to buy some Jewels by order of the Alcaide of *Tetuan*; Captain *Delavall* came with them, but Landed at *Malaga*, and comes hither by Land. Two English Men of War commanded by Captain *Munden* and Captain *Edwards*, sailed from hence the 2d Instant to Cruize. The Almirante of *Castile* came some days ago to *St. Lucar*, and is expected here in a short time. The 3 Spanish Merchant Ships which arrived here some days ago from the *West-Indies*, are unloading; They came from the *Havana* in company of 2 more, one of which is put into *St. Lucar*, but the other having on board Don *Martin de Zavala* Commander in chief of this Squadron, was separated from the rest in bad Weather, and is still missing. Our last Advices from *Ceuta* say, the *Moor* continue before that Place, but have not of late made any considerable Attack, being disheartened by the ill Success they have had during this tedious Siege; On the other hand the Spanish Garrison receive frequent Recruits from *Spain*, and are plentifully supplied from time to time with all sorts of Provisions and Ammunition.

Corunna, Jan. 27. The Spanish Expedition Pacquet-boat arrived here yesterday from *Falmouth*, and will sail again as soon as the Wind is fair. Our last Letters from *Madrid* say, the King of *Spain* enjoys a perfect Health; That the Conde of *Monterey* continued at his House in the Country; and 'twas discouried, that the Almirante would very soon be sent for to Court again.

Warsaw, Jan. 5. The Cardinal Primate is gone to *Lowitz*, where he intends to continue till the King of *Poland* returns from *Dresden*; The Cardinal before his departure from hence, had a meeting with the Elector of *Brandenburg's* Deputies and having in their presence put the Jewels, which were lately given into his Hands by the Crown Treasurer, into a Box, and made an Inventory of them, the same was shut up, and sealed with his Seal and with the Seals of the said Deputies, after which the said Box was delivered to the Castellain *Hruslawky* and the Starost *Wisky*, who are appointed Commissioners from this Republiek to receive the City of *Elbing* from the Elector of *Brandenburg's* Commissioners, to whom they are to deliver the

said Jewels the day before that Place is evacuated. The Cardinal having received Advice that the King of *Poland* has deferred his return hither till after the Carnival, he has sent to him the Circular Letters for the meeting of the General Diet to be signed, and as soon as they are brought back, they will be dispatched to the several Palatinates, to the end they may choose their Deputies, and the Diet be ready to meet soon after the King's return. The Crown-General and the other General Officers continue their Conferences at *Radom*, for settling the Atrears of the Forces of the Crown, and of the Duchy of *Lituania*, which amount to a very great Sum.

Copenhagen, Jan. 12. There is yet no time set for the King's Journey to *Holstein*, and some are of opinion 'tis quite put off. The new Levies are carried on with great Diligence, and the Ministers who are entrusted with the Care of Military Matters, have given Directions for furnishing the Magazines in this Kingdom with Stores and Provisions, and for putting both the Sea and Land Forces on as good a foot as is possible. The Differences between this Court and the Envoys from Foreign Princes residing here, about the manner of their Reception, and some other Points of Ceremony, are not yet adjusted, so that none of them has yet had Audience of the King.

Vicna, Jan. 9. Orders are sent to the Emperor's Officers in *Hungary*, to get together a sufficient quantity of Provisions for the Subsistence of the Forces that are to be employed in finishing the new Fortifications of *Arat*, which Work is to be begun as soon as the Season will permit. The States of *Austria* will open their Assembly in a day or two, and 'tis said Count *Caunitz*, Vice-Chancellor of the Empire, is to preside there as the Emperor's Commissioner; They have sent two of their Body to Compliment the Grand Signior's Ambassador on his Arrival in these Parts; The said Ambassador was received at *Raab* with much Solemnity, the Garrison and Purghers were in Arms, and the Governor entertained him very nobly; His Excellency continues his Journey towards this place, and he is to stay at *Pottendorf* till every thing be in a readines here for his Reception. The 6th Instant being the Empress's Birth-day, who entered into the 45th year of her Age she received upon this occasion the Compliments of the Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Quality, and in the evening the Court were entertained with a Ball, and a Consort of Musick. Cardinal *Sancta Croce*, the Pope's Nuncio, is indisposed, which is the reason he has not yet begun his Journey to *Rome*. Cardinal *Grimani* and Cardinal *Collnitz* are preparing to go thither, but 'tis believed the latter will be first sent by

by the Emperor to *Prisbourg*, to preside in the Assembly of the States of *Hungary*, who are to assemble in a very short time in order to raise the Subsidies demanded of them by the Emperor, and to provide for the Subsistence of the Imperial Forces in *Hungary*.

Hamburg, Jan. 17 R. S. The *Sieur Gramont*, whom the States-General of the United Provinces have appointed to assist as their Envoy and Plenipotentiary at the Conferences for adjusting the Difference between the King of *Denmark* and the Duke of *Holslein*, arrived here the 13th Instant from *Holland*; And the next day he gave notice of his Arrival to the several Foreign Ministers that are here, and has since received from them the usual Visits. Very little Progress is yet made towards an Accommodation of the Affair of *Holslein*, the *Danish* Ministers hitherto refusing toarken to any Proposals of that kind, until the Duke of *Holslein* has demolished the Forts he built some time ago in the *Dutchy of Holslein*, and the Duke on the other side seeming resolved not to consent to it, and it's said some of the Mediators do think it unreasonable this should be insisted on as a Preliminary Article; And the King of *Sweden* and the Duke of *Cold* have declared, that they will assist his Highness with their Forces in case the *Dans* begin any Hostilities against him. This Negotiation being thus at a stand, the *Danish* Ministers are gone from hence to pass some time at *Kehl*, near which place a Camp is marked out for 12000 *Dans*. The Duke of *Wirtemberg* continues to review the *Danish* Forces in *Holslein*, and to give the necessary Orders that every thing may be in a readiness for attacking the new Forts as soon as the Frost comes, being obliged to defer it till then, because the *Holsleiners* have laid all the Country round about under water. In the meantime we have Advice, that about 7000 *Swedes* are drawing together near *Wismar*, where they are to continue in a Body till the issue of this Affair be seen, and some Regiments of *Lunenburger*s are advancing towards the *Elbe* with the same Intention. The Elector of *Brandenburgh* persists in his Resolution not to allow passage to the *Saxon* Forces through his Territories, which the King of *Denmark* would take into his Service. Our Letters from *Berlin* say, the Discourse continues that his Electoral Highness intends shortly to take a Journey to *Prussia*. They write from *Dresden*, that great Preparations are making in that Place for the Carnival, against which time the King of *Poland* is expected there from *Lipsich*. The States of the Electorate of *Saxony* are still assembled, and have received another Message from the King, to press them to conclude the Matters before them, which he is desirous to have settled before he returns to *Warsaw*.

Plymouth, Jan. 23. This day sailed from hence the Adventure of this Place, *Nicholas Perdue* Master, bound to *Barbadoes*; The *Boundventure* of *London*, commanded by *Francis Purchese*, for *St. Sebastian*, and the *Faithful Galley*, *Cheney Matthews* Commander, for *Antego*.

Doyle, Jan. 27. The *Ann and Mary*, Capt. *Phillips* Commander, is arrived in the Downs from the *Canaries*; the *Catherine*, Capt. *Cowstone*, from *Cadix*; and the *Barcelona*, Capt. *Tibbington*, from *Neville*. The *Somers* Frigate, Capt. *Douglass* Commander, and three other Ships bound to the *East-Indies*; the *Betha*, Capt. *Smy*, bound to the *Streights*; and divers other Merchant Ship bound to *Guinea*, *Spain*, and the *West-Indies*, making in all about 23 Sail, failed out of the Downs this morning on their respective Voyages.
