HE Lyme Man of War commanded by Captain Trevanian, arrived here the 25th of the last Month from Tetuan; He brought with him a Moorish Collonel to buy some lewels by order of the Alcaide of Tetuan Captain Delavall came with them, but Landed at Malaga, and comes hither by Land. English Men of War commanded by Captain Munden and Captain Edwards, failed from hence the 2d Instant to Cruize. The Almirante of Cafille came some days ago to St. Lucar, and is expected here in a short time. The 3 Spanish Merchant Ships which arrived here some days ago from the West-Indies, are unlading; They came from the Havana in company of one of which is put into St. Lucar, but the other having on board Don Martin de Zavala Commander in chief of this Squadron, was feparated from the rest in bad Weather, and is still missing. Our last Advices from Ceuta say, the Moors continue before that Place, but have not of late made any confiderable Attack, being disheartened by the ill Success they have had during this tedious Siege; On the other hand the Spanish Garrison receive frequent Recruits from Spain, and are plentifully supplied from time to time with all sorts of Provisions and

Country, Jan. 27. The Spanish Expedition Pacquer-boat arrived here yetterday from Falmouth, and will fail again as foon as the Wind is fair. Wasaw, J.m. 5. The Crown-General and the other General Officers continue their Conferences at Radom, for fettling the Atreats of the Forces of the Crown, and of the Dutchy of Litbusnia, which amount to a very great Sum.

Copenhagen, Jan. 12. There is yet no time fer for the King's Journey to Holftein, and some are of opinion 'ris quite put off. The new Levies are carried on with great Diligence, and the Ministers who are entrusted with the Care of Military Matters, have given Directions for furnishing the Magazines in this Kingdom with Stores and Provisions, and for putting both the Sea and Land Forces on as good a foor as is possible. The Differences between this Court and the Envoys from Foreign Princes residing here, about the manner of their Reception, and some other Points of Ceremony, are not yet adjusted, so that none of them has yet had Audience of the King.

Vienna, Jan 9. Orders are fent to the Emperor's Officers in Hungary, to get together a sufficient quantity of Provisions for the Sublistence of the Forces that are to be employed in finishing the new Fortifications of Arat, which Work is to be begun as soon as the Season will permit. The States of Austria will open their Assembly in a day or two, and 'ris faid Count Caunitz, Vice-Chancellor of the Empire, is to prefide there as the Emperor's Commissioner; They have fent two of their Body to Compliment the Grand Signior's Ambailador on his Arrival in these Parts: The faid Ambassador was received at Raab with much Solemnity, the Garrison and Purghers were in Arms, and the Governor entertained him very nobly; His Excellency continues his Journey to-wards this place, and he is to fray at Pottendorf till every thing be in a readiness here for his Reception. The 6th Instant being the Empress's Birth-day, who entred into the 45th year of her Age she received upon this occasion the Compliments of the Foreign Ministers, and other Perfons of Quality, and in the evening the Court were entertained with a Ball, and a Confort of Mufick. Cardinal Sancta Croce, the Pope's Nuncio, is indisposed, which is the reason he has not yet begun his Journey to Rome. Hanburgh, Jan. 17 N. S. The Sieur Granem-bourg, whom the States-General of the United Provinces have appointed to affift as their Envoy and Plenipotentially at the Conferences for adjusting the Difference between the King of Domark and the Duke of Hold in, arrived here the 13th Instant from Holland; And the next day he gave notice of his Arrival to the several Foreign Miniflers that are here, and has fince received from them the usual Visits. Very little Progress is yet made towards an Accommodation of the Affair of Holftein, the Danish Ministers hitherto refusing to harken to any Proposals of that kind, until the Duke of Holskin has demolished the Forts he built some time ago in the Dutchy of Holfein, and the Duke on the other fide feeming resolved not to confent to it, and it's faid some of the Mediators do think it unreasonable this should be infifted on as a Preliminary Article; And the King of Sweden and the Duke of Cell liave declared, that they will afilf his Highness with their Forces in ease the Danes begin any Hostilities against him. This Negociation being thus at a stand, the Danesh Ministers are gone from hence to pass some time dt Eld, near which place a Camp is marked out for 12000 Dines. The Duke of Wirtemberg conrinues to review the Danish Forces in Holstein, and to give the necessary Orders that every thing may be in a readinest for attacking the new Forts as foon as the Proft comes, being obliged to defer it till then, because the Holsteners have laid all the Country found about under water. In the mean time we have Advice, that about 7000 Swedes are drawing together near Wifmar, where they are to continue in Body till the issue of this Affair be feen, and some Regiments of Lumenburgers are advancing towards the Elbe with the fame Intention. The Elector of Brand aburgh pertifts in his Refolution nor to allow passage to the Saxon Forces through his Territories, which the King of Denmark would take into his Service. Our Letters from Berlin Lay, the Discourse continues that his Electoral Highness intends shortly to take a Journey to Profile. They write from Dresiden, that great Preparations are making in that Place for the Carnaval, against which time the King of Po and is expected there from Leipfich.
