A PROCLAMATION.

WILLIAM R.

Hereas We have been Informed, That a False, Scandalow, and Traiterous Libel, Intituled, An Inquiry into the Causes of the Misserriage of the Scotch-Colony at Darien, or, An Answer to a Libel, Intituled, A Defence of the San Abdicating Darien, has been Printed and Difpofd, the Design of which Libel was to Create a M.f. mierkanding between Our good Subjects of England and Scotland, and to Stir up Sedicion and Rebeilion, end is Injurious to, and Reflects on the Honour of both Fations: And whereas the Knights, Citizens and Burfir in Parliament Affembled, have humbly befought Ut, to Isue Our Royal Proclamation for Discovering and Apprehending of the Author and Printer of the sail Loel; We therefore (with the Advice of Our Printers) of Countil) have thought fit to Issue this Our Royal Prolamation, hereby Requiring and Commanding all On Loving Subjects what seever, to Discover and Appelo nd ih: Author and Printer of the Said Libel, to the edities may be dealt withal and proceeded against acording to Law. And We do hereby Promise and Dedue, That whosever shall Discover or Apprehend : he Axbor of the faid Libel, so as he may be brought to Jufite, fall Have and Receive, as a Reward for fuch Disputy and Apprehending, the Sum of Five hundred Pends: And that whosever spall Discover and Appre-ked the Printer thereof, so as he may be brought to Jufite, shall Have and Receive, as a Reward for such Discovery or Apprehending, the Sum of Two hundred roads; Which said respective Sums of Five hundred Punds and Two hundred Pounds, the Commissioners of Our Treasury are hereby Required and Directed to Pay accordingly. And We do hereby further Promise and Dulate, That if any Person (other than the Author binslif) who was any ways Privy to, or Instrumental in the Printing and Dispersing the said Libil, shall Disour or Apprehend the Author thereof, the Person mais suo Discovery, or Apprehending the Said Author, hall not only have the faid Sum of Five hundred Pounds, as astrefaid, but also Our Gracious Purdon for his Offree. And We do hereby firitly Charge and Comused all Our Loving Subjects (as they will answer the therary at their Perils) that they do not any ways Causal, but Discover and Apprehend the Author and Primer of the faid Libel, to the end they may be Prouiled against with the utmost Soverity according to

Madrid, Jan. 14. N. S. The King of Spain Continues in very good Health; His Carholick Majefly when he was last at the Escurial found so

pleased with the Place, that he intends to return thinker in the Spring. The Count of Berlips, who has been at the Courts of Vienna and Bruffels with the Character of the King's Envoy Extraordina-ry, is lately returned hither. The Count of Pilati, Gentleman of the Chamber to the King of the Romans, being fent hither to notifie the Birth of the young Arch Dutchefs, had Audience some days ago of their Catholick Majeslies, and here has been Illuminations and other publick Expressions of Joy on this occasion. The King has lately created Nine Knights of the Golden Fleece, viz. The Duke d'Arschot, the Marquis of Risbourg, the Prince of Rubempre, the Marquis de Corflans, the Marquis de Pescara, Prince Paligonia, Don Domingo d'Aquaviria, Count Windifgratz, and Count Lamberg; He has made the Marquis of Laconi Captain of his Guards, and Don Thomas d'Arias Captain-General of the Province of Gui-The Conde Montercy continues in the King's Disfavour.

Venice, January 22. A Convoy of 12 Ships laden with Stores and Provisions for the Venetian Forces in the Mores, will fail from hence in a day or two, and Orders have been dispatched to the Captain-General Cornaro to fend some Men of War to meet them in the Gulph of Castaro, and convoy them to Napoli di Romania. An Envoy from the Duke of Lorrain to the Duke of Mantua arrived here some days ago. Our Letters from Rome of the 17th Instant say, the Pope was much better, and had lately signed several Dispatches, and disposed of some vacant Offices, and that 'twas said he would shortly hold a Congregation in his Apartment, to perform the Ceremony of Opening and Shutting the Mouths, and giving the Caps to the new Cardinals. They write from Messina, that divers Vessels were sailed out of that Port

laden with Corn for Spain.

Copymhagen, Jan. 26. The Preparations for fitting out our Fleet very early in the Spring, and the new Levies in this Kingdom, are continued with great Diligence. The Margrave of Baden-Dourlash came hither fome days go from Germany; He had several Conferences with the King of Denmark, and is fince gone to the Court of Sweden. 'Tis faid, the King of Denmark intends to borrow 500000 Dollars at Interest, and to assign part of his Revenues in the Province of south Ditmersia, for Repayment thereof.

Sieur Strahlenheim, late Envoy from the King of Sweden to the Courts of Hanouer and Cell, being ordered to go with the same Character to the Imperial Court, is come hisher in his way to Vienna.
