NOTICE is hereby given that on the 28th September 1942, the Minister of War Transport confirmed the Tirbont Bridge (Restriction of Traffic) Order, 1942, made by the Carmarthenshire County Council under Section 46 of the Road Traffic Act, 1930, and Section 29 of the Road and Rail Traffic Act, 1933.

The effect of the Order is to prohibit the use by all mechanically-propelled and horse-drawn vehicles of that length of the unclassified road from Penybanc to Beaulieu-fawr and Cwmffrwd in the Parish of Llangunnon in the county of Carmarthen, which lies

between its junction with the Carmarthen-Cross Hands Trunk Road (Route A.48) at Penybanc and the road junction approximately 453 yards to the south-west of its junction with Route A.48, subject to exemptions in the case of agricultural and Tradesmen's vehicles requiring to use the road on either side of Tirbont Bridge.

The Order is available for inspection at the County Offices, Carmarthen.
