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From Monday, April 19. to Thursday, April 22. 1669.

Esterday came in here the Hopewell, with another ship of Ramsgate from Burdeaux, laden with Wines and bound for London; as also the Expedition of Lime laden with Fruit from Malaga: she came out thence incompany with 18 other English Merchant ships and 3 Dutch Men of War, which last, off the South Cape discovered 2 Sails, which supposing to be Turks, they made up to them with all the sail they could, after some hours spens in the chace, several Guns were fired, but with what success is not yet known; upon their way homewards they met with the Tyger, Mary, and Nightingale, three of his Majessies Men of War; from whom they were in little time separated by soul weather.

A small Vessel of this place from St. Mali's, tells us, that two great ships laden there for Cales, were (upon sear of a new breach with Spain) unladen; but beso e her departure had sgain taken in these fraught, intending to prosecute their

deligned Voyage.

Plym uth, April 16. Yesterday arrived here the Montague and Tyger two of His Majesties Fregates, from the Streights; having about 8 dayes since lost company in a storm of 7 or 8 Merchant ships which came under their Convoy. This Evening some ships are discovered in the Offin, which 'tis hoped may be some of those Merechants.

Venice, April 3. From several parts of Turkey we are daily told of great preparations made for the Carrying on of the War this Summer against this Republick, and for the entire Conquest of Candia, upon which the Grand-Segnior is wholly intent; and for that end has made extraordipary provilion of all Necessaries for the supply of a vast Army which he designs for that service; but 'tis believed he will not be abe to lend fuch numbers of men into the field as was expected; the warm fervice which they are fensible of, and the great loss of men they have already received before the Town of Candia, discouraging others from entring too haltily into that Employment; especially fince the Chaiftian Princes have shewn themselves so ready to lend their affifting hands for the Support of the Venetians about a thouland Turkish soldiers raised in Asia for the recruit of the Vilier's Army, and lying ready at Alexandria to be imbarked, upon the Naws attiving there of the success of the belieged in their Mines; and the loss of men su lained by the Turks upon some Sallies made out of the Town, fell into a mutiny a and plainly refuling the fervices disbanded themselves; and had flain the Bussa who endeavor'd to appeale them; had he not timely conveyed himself into a place of security.

The Turks purfue their defigur of Battering the Town with their (annon from the Mount lately raised near the Bastion of St. Andre, but neither has this great Work of theirs the effect propoted by the Visier, our people having much advanced their Works within the said Bastion, and rodivert the Turks, made some Sallies upon them on that side

with confiderable execution.

In the mean while the Viller feating least the Christian Princes by their joynt affiltance will in few Moneths endeavor to frustrate all his labours for the gaining of the Town, and consequently expose him to the rage of his incensed Matter; to whom he has given frequent assurances of persect, ing that Work, is with more earnestness the ever emploied in the Siege, using all his Oratory for the incom-

ragement of his people; hoping by his many Mine; and constant plying of his Guas; to make himself Master of one of the Gates; but has not yet effected any thing considerable. Onely Colonel Jean Battista Zacco endeavoring with much courage to have taken a Gallery from the Enemy near Fanto Spirito, was unfortunately buried in one of their Mines; but the General sending out a strong party, by force of arms and much slaughter of the Turks, recovered his body out of the ruins of the Mine, and carried it honourably into the Town, to give it burial in a more sacred place.

The Senate has taken care for the fitting up and hiring of leveral ships to be in readiness to attend the arrival of the sources designed hither from several Princes of Italy; viz. from the Dukes of Modena; Mantua, Parma, and Savoy, which they have raised part upon their own, and part upon the expence of this Republick; with 3000 Germans raised upon the Popes desire by His Imperial Majesties permission, and to be sent under his Name for Candia.

Segnior Piero Diedo having upon his great indisposition of body desired to be excused from his Voyage as Commander and Director of the Convoy into the Levant, the Senate has been pleased to chuse in his room Cavalier Zorzi Gornaro, a person who has formely given eminent proofs of his Valour and Conduct, in several services both in Gandia and Dalmatia.

A Vessel lately arrived here from Constantinople, tells us, that several French Men of War were met by her in the Dardaness, attending the Commands of their Ambassador, who was at Larisia, where he had Orders from the Most Christian King his Master, to require that Justice might be done upon the Bassa of Tunis, for the Cruelty shewn to the French Consul of that place, and satisfaction

given to his Master for the affront of it.

Lisbonne, April 3. On Sunday last the Inquisitors as Judges held their Tribunal or Court, erected in the Palace-yard, in presence of the Prince and Princels, with a great number of the Nobility and Gentry, in which 80 persons were brought to their Tryal, having a Banner of the Cross carried before them, supported by the Dominicans 5 after a Sermon presched upon that occasion, the Prisonets were brought one by one before an Altar raised in the midst of the Tribunal, and there detained, whilst their Accusation and Sentence was read. One person only a Priest accused of Sodomy and some other Crimes, was condemned to be degraded, to forfeit his Estate and to be fent for ten years to the Gallies. The rest were accused of Judzisme, of which some came out in black habits with a Candle in their hands, these having not sufficient proof against them, were dismist, paying onely their charges. A second fort appearing in yellow Coats, with a Red Cross, who being accused for that being born Christians, they had lived after the Law of Moses, which was evidenced against them, were declared Jews, but promising for the future to live in obedience to the Pope and the Roman Catholick Church, were condemned only to the forfeiture of their Goods, and by a stroke on the head with a Rod, and the sprinkling with Holy water, again received into the Church. Only one of the prisoner, a Priest, appeared in a Flame-coloured Coar, with his Picture on the forepart of it, who having infficient evidence brought in of his Judaizing, and having confessed that he believed a man might be laved by either Law, and therefore himfelf oblerved ometimes the one, and at other times the other,

was alcelared an Apollate, and sentenced to be degraded to forfeit al his Estate, and to be farther punishe according to Law, and accordingly was there presently degraded and delivered to the secular Justice, in whose Court he was condemned to be burnt to ashes, and those to be thrown into the River, and his name to be infamous, which was presently put in execution, but he choosing to die a Chriitian, had the favour to be first strangled.

Here is fately arrived Monfieur Betun from the Court of France, bringing the Complements of His Most Christian Majesty upon the Birth of the young Princels, with a Present to the Princes Regent, to the value of 40000 Crowns, and others of considerable value to the young

Princels:

Eranck fort, April 4. 'Tis much feared leaft the late Adion of the Prince Palatine Adolph John the onely Brother to the late King of Sweden, in lurprising the Castle of Overbrun, may in little time occasion farther disturbances. The Count de Lininguen, one of the Presidents of the Imperial Chamber, has publishe his Manifest, charging the Prince with over violent proceeding, aggravating the manner of it with all its circumstances, and accusing him of a b. each of the publick peace of the Empire, which the Prince has endeavoured to answe, justifying himself apon his bargain made with him for the County of Rixinguen, upon which he had ad vanced a confiderable fumme of Moneys, our alloiging that the Count had used several subtle practicesy and not dealt fairly with him upon the Contract, that he had seised upon the Revenues arising from the County, and made himself the first Aggressor, and could not with reason complain of a territa but excusing the excels committed by the Soldiers in plundering the Castle, for which they had no Order; at the last offering for the ending of all farther controversie to give up his bargain and disanul the Contract, on condition, the Moneya which he had advanced upon it may be restored to him: 't's believed, the I aperial Chamber will proceed vigoroully in this business.

Genoua, April 10. The last week departed hence Segnior Gio. Lucca Durazzo for the Court of Rome, as Envoye Extraordinary from this Republick, who embatked him-felf upon one of the Callies of the squadoon belonging to this Port, and put to lea with a fair wind.

Some tew days fince passed by a Courier from Reme, intending for Prevence in France, carrying with him to the Vice-Legate of Avignon the Popes Standard, which he is ordered to see solemnly delivered to the Duke de Beaufort as Admiral of the French Fleet intended for the re-lief of Candia; the same Courier being ordered to pass from thence with all possible speed for Madrid to quicken the zeal of that Court, and to press them to hasten forwards their succours designed for the same service.

From Milan they-tell us, that the Marquis de los Balbacces spinola their Governour, was goi g thence for Pavia to be prelent at the General Muster, and that the Prince di Buzzolo was arrived at Milan on his way also for Pa via, where he intended to take a view of the German Infantry at their Rendezvous, and 'tis believed a confiderable Reformation will be then or a little after made a nongst the, Militia for the ease and latisfaction of the people.

The Marquis has by his publick Edict confirmed all the former Acts of the Governours of Milan, his Predecelfors, in favour of the Church, particularly, those of the Segniors Ambrofia Spinola his Grandfath r, the Constable of Cafille, the Count Fuentes, and Duke of Feria, Areightly charging all the Tribunals and Judges of the State to take

care for the due observation of them.

Paris, April 26. The 22 instant, a Courier arrived here from the Court de Vivonne, General of the Gallies, by whom His Majesty received an account of his late Voyage to Algiers, where upon complaint made to the Basha of that place, of divers violations of the Treaty, the Basha ordered several of his Captains to be severely punished in his light, and some of the Moneys to be restored which had been taken unjuftly by them at lea.

The 24th instant, the sum of 500 thousand Liures was

ordered to be immediately employ'd for the payment of the forces deligned for Candia, one halfe of that fum being remitted by Bills of exchange to Lyons, the other to be paid out of His Majesties Receipts in Provence.

The same day departed hence the Duke d' Elboeuf with the Ladies his Sister and Daughter for Lorrain, where the Marriage is to be consummated between his Daughter and the Prince de Vaudemont, His Majesty refuting to fign the Contract, in which the Duke of Larrana was amongst his other Titles, stiled Count of Provence, 'Tis faid His Majesty is of late somewhat distatisfied at some

proceedings of the Duke of Lorrain.

On Wednelday last arrived a Courier from Bruffels, by whom we are told, that the Constable of Castille has exprest his willingness to comply with his Majesties defires, and rogive him the farisfaction of suppressing the new Impositions upon such Merchandiles as pass into ct come from any the Towns of his late Conquests in the Netherlands, but humbly defires that His Majesty would please fi it to Order that all things may be put in o the same flate and posture as they were in at the conclusion of the Treaty at Aix la Chapelle, and particularly that the Placards for confilcation of the Estates of such as live within the Spanish Quarters be suppressed; that the Towin of Marimont, Fountain t' Evesque, and Rodomaken in Luxer burg, be reffored to them, and the Prince de Ligne be repossessed of his Estate which has been seised by the Prince d' Espinoy.

Monsieur de Vaubrun Nogens defigned Envoye to the Blector of Brandenbourgh, having received his dispatches in order to his journey, may in few days depart hence.

Yesterday his Excellency Mr. Montague, Ambassadour from His Malesty of Great Britain, made his Publick Entry into this City, in which he was accompanied by the Mareshal de Bellefonds and the Sieur de Bonnavit the Officer appointed for the introducing of Ambassadours, in H's Majesties Coach ; which was immediately sollowed by those of the Ambiliadours, and after them by the Queens and a numerous Train of thele belonging to the Princes of the Blood and others of the Nobility: being atrived at his Lodging, he was there complemented from His Majesty by the Dake de St. aignan, Chief Gentleman of the Chamber, from the Queen by the Marquis de Haute-fort Master of her Horie, from Monsieur by the Comre du Plesses Chief Gentleman of his Chamber, and from Madam by the Marquis de Clerambaut the Master of her Horse.

This day he was with as much Ceremony conducted to his Audience from His Maj sty by the Chevalier de Lorraine and the Sicur de Bonnevil, and had afterwards bis Audience also from the Queen, the Dauphin, the Dake of

Arjou and Madam.

This last week the Duke de Navailles went hence for Thoulon, to command the forces defigned for Candia Ten Capacins are likewise gone from several Convents in this City, to take care of the Hospitals which are to be set up in Candia for such of the French as shall happen to be sick or wounded in that service.

Portsmouth, April 20. On Sunday last came to an Anchor ar Spitthead two Dutch Men of War, which failed again yeilerday, being followed by three great Merchant fairs which came under their Convoy from the Streights; they touched at Comes, from whence passed in their com-puny for Holland an English ship laden with Tobacco from Virginie.
