BY THE KING.
A PROCLAMATION

DIRECTING THAT CERTAIN MALE BRITISH SUBJECTS SHALL BECOME LIABLE TO BE CALLED UP FOR SERVICE IN THE ARMED FORCES OF THE CROWN AND THAT CERTAIN WOMEN BRITISH SUBJECTS SHALL BECOME LIABLE TO BE CALLED UP FOR SERVICE IN THE WOMEN'S ROYAL NAVAL SERVICE, THE AUXILIARY TERRITORIAL SERVICE AND THE WOMEN'S AUXILIARY AIR FORCE.

GEORGE, R.I.

Whereas by the National Service Acts, 1939 to 1942, it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for Us by Proclamation to direct that, save as therein otherwise provided, all Our subjects for the time being in Great Britain who at the date of Our Proclamation have attained, or who at any time thereafter shall attain, such age, not being less than eighteen years, as We may specify by such Proclamation and have not attained such greater age, not being more than fifty-one years, as We may so specify, shall on the dates therein mentioned become liable under the said Acts to be called up for service in Our Armed Forces but that the Forces for service in which a woman shall be liable to be called up shall be the Women's Royal Naval Service, the Auxiliary Territorial Service and the Women's Auxiliary Air Force and that Proclamations may apply either to men only or to women only or to both men and women and may make different provisions in relation to men and women:

And whereas it is further enacted by the said Acts that, save as therein provided, no person shall be liable thereunder to be called up for service who—

(a) not being a person ordinarily resident in Great Britain is, either under the provisions of any Act in force in any part of Our dominions outside Great Britain, a national or a citizen of that part within the meaning of that Act, or a person born or domiciled in any such part of Our dominions or in a British protectorate, mandated territory, or any other country or territory being a country or territory under Our protection or suzerainty; or

(b) is a person employed in the service of the Government of a part of Our dominions outside Great Britain, or in the service of the Government of a British protectorate, a mandated territory or some other country or territory which is under Our protection or suzerainty, being a person whose presence in Great Britain is occasioned solely by his or her employment in that service; or

(c) is a member of any of Our Armed Forces other than the Home Guard or Auxiliary Coast-guard and other than—

(i) a person being an officer holding an unpaid commission in the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve (Sea Cadet Corps); or

(ii) an officer of the Territorial Army Reserve of Officers commissioned for service with the Army Cadet Force; or

(iii) a commissioned officer of the Training Branch of the Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve; or

(d) is a woman of any of the following classes, that is to say—

(i) Members of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service or any reserve thereof,

(ii) Members of the Women's Royal Naval Service,

(iii) Women medical practitioners serving in the Royal Navy or any naval reserve,

(iv) Members of Queen Alexandra's Imperial Military Nursing Service or any reserve thereof,

(v) Members of the Territorial Army Nursing Service or any reserve thereof,

(vi) Members of the Auxiliary Territorial Service,

(vii) Women employed with the Royal Army Medical Corps or The Army Dental Corps with relative rank as officers,

(viii) Members of Princess Mary's Royal Air Force Nursing Service or any reserve thereof,

(ix) Members of the Women's Auxiliary Air Force, or

(x) Women employed with the Medical Branch or the Dental Branch of the Royal Air Force with relative rank as officers,

not being a woman whose enrolment or other undertaking to serve was for part-time service only or for service without remuneration; or

(e) is undergoing training as a cadet at the Royal Military Academy, the Royal Military College, or the Royal Air Force College; or

(f) is in holy orders or a regular minister of any religious denomination; or

(g) is the subject of an order or inquisition under the Lunacy and Mental Treatment Acts, 1890 to 1930, or is being detained in pursuance of section twenty-five of the Lunacy Act, 1890, or as a criminal lunatic or in pursuance of an order made under the Criminal Lunatics Act, 1884, or is undergoing treatment as a temporary patient under section five of the Mental Treatment Act, 1930, or is a person placed in an institution or a certified house, or under guardianship, under section three of the Mental Deficiency Act, 1913, or is the subject of an order under section six, eight, or nine of that Act, or is under supervision provided under paragraph (b) of section thirty of that Act or is an inmate of a home approved under section fifty of that Act, or is the subject of a notification under subsection (2) of section fifty-one of that Act; or

(h) is the subject of an order or warrant for his or her detention or custody under the Lunacy (Scotland) Acts, 1857 to 1919, or is being entertained and kept in an asylum in pursuance of section fifteen of the Lunacy (Scotland) Act, 1866, or is a person for whose safe custody during Our pleasure We are authorised to give order or is a prisoner whom the Secretary of State or the Prisons Department for Scotland has, in pursuance of any

Act, directed to be removed to a criminal lunatic asylum or to the criminal lunatic department of Perth prison or to an asylum, or is a person placed in an institution or a certified house or under guardianship under section four of the Mental Deficiency and Lunacy (Scotland) Act, 1913, or is the subject of an order under section seven, nine, or ten of that Act; or

(i) is certified by a local authority, as defined by the Blind Persons Acts, 1920 and 1938, to be registered as a blind person under arrangements made by the authority under those Acts; or

(j) is a married woman not living apart from her husband under a decree or order of any Court or a woman who has living with her a child of hers under the age of fourteen, including a step-child and an illegitimate child and, if the adoption took place before the passing of the National Service (No. 2) Act, 1941, an adopted child (whether adopted under the Adoption of Children Act, 1926, the Adoption of Children (Scotland) Act, 1930, or otherwise):

And whereas it is also enacted by the National Service (Armed Forces) Act, 1939, that any person who at the commencement of that Act was registered under the Military Training Act, 1939, or who was required to be so registered at any time before the commencement of the National Service (Armed Forces) Act, 1939, shall be liable to be called up for service under the last mentioned Act notwithstanding that he may not be so liable by virtue of any Proclamation made under that Act:

And whereas by Our Proclamations dated the first day of October, 1939, the first day of December, 1939, the first day of January, 1940, the ninth day of May, 1940, the twenty-ninth day of January, 1941, the twenty-seventh day of November, 1941, the eighteenth day of December, 1941, the fifth day of March, 1942, the twenty-third day of July, 1942, and the twenty-second day of October, 1942, We did in pursuance of the said Acts direct, declare and proclaim that certain of Our male subjects therein mentioned were liable under those Acts to be called up for service in Our Armed Forces and that certain of Our women subjects therein mentioned were liable under those Acts to be called up for service in the Women's Royal Naval Service, the Auxiliary Territorial Service and the Women's Auxiliary Air Force:

Now, therefore, We do in pursuance of the National Service Acts, 1939 to 1942, hereby direct, declare and proclaim that with the exceptions hereinafter mentioned—

(1) all Our male subjects who at the date of this Our Proclamation have attained the age of eighteen years but have not attained the age of forty-six years and who are, at the date of this Our Proclamation, within Great Britain or who, not having been in Great Britain at that date, subsequently enter it, are on the date hereof or on the date on which they first subsequently enter Great Britain after the date hereof, by this Our Proclamation liable under the said Acts to be called up for service in Our Armed Forces: and

(2) all Our male subjects who, at any time after the date of this Our Proclamation, attain the age of eighteen years and are then within Great Britain or who, not then being in Great Britain subsequently enter it, are, on attaining that age, or on the date on which they first subsequently enter Great Britain after attaining that age, by this Our Proclamation liable under the said Acts to be called up for service in Our Armed Forces: and

(3) all Our women subjects who, at the date of this Our Proclamation, have attained the age of nineteen years but have not attained the age of thirty-one years and who are at the date of this Our Proclamation within Great Britain or who, not having been in Great Britain at that date, subsequently enter it are on the date hereof or on the date on which they first subsequently enter Great Britain after the date hereof, by this Our Proclamation liable under the said Acts to be called up for service in the Women's Royal Naval Service, the Auxiliary Territorial Service and the Women's Auxiliary Air Force: and

(4) all Our women subjects who, at any time after the date of this Our Proclamation, attain the age of nineteen years and are then within Great Britain or who, not then being in Great Britain, subsequently enter it, are on attaining that age or on the date on which they first subsequently enter Great Britain after attaining that

age, by this Our Proclamation liable under the said Acts to be called up for service in the Women's Royal Naval Service, the Auxiliary Territorial Service and the Women's Auxiliary Air Force.

And We do hereby order Our Minister of Labour and National Service to give all necessary directions herein accordingly.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this Thirteenth day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and forty-three and in the Seventh year of Our Reign.

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Order in Council dated the 9th November, 1934, the grant of a special duty allowance of 3d. a day was sanctioned to Telegraphist ratings:

"And whereas we consider it desirable that this allowance should be extended to Telegraphist ratings (S.O.):

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased to sanction with effect from the 10th December, 1942, the grant of this special allowance to Telegraphist ratings (S.O.) provided a proper standard of proficiency is attained.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 17th and 18th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 84, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for apportioning the income of the Benefice of Easington, in the County and the Diocese of Durham, between that Benefice and the Benefice of Shotton in the said County and Diocese:

Whereas the patronage of the said two Benefices is vested in the Bishop of Durham for the time being:

And whereas we are of opinion that additional provision should be made for the cure of souls within the Parish of the said Benefice of Shotton by means of that apportionment of the income of the said

Benefice of Easington which is hereinafter recommended and proposed, and that the said Benefice of Easington will thereafter still be sufficiently endowed:

And whereas the said Benefice of Easington is now vacant, the late Incumbent thereof being the Reverend George Algernon West in whose favour an annual pension of £345 is payable out of the income of the Benefice:

Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cyril, Archbishop of York, as Archbishop of the Province within which the said two Benefices are situate and with the consent of the Right Reverend Alwyn, Bishop of Durham, as such Bishop and also as the Patron in right of his See of the said two Benefices (in testimony whereof they have executed this Scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day of the date on which the aforesaid annual pension of £345 shall cease to be payable to the said George Algernon West and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same a sum of £4,285 14s. 4d. Conversion £3 ros. od. per cent. Stock, being part of a larger sum of the same Stock held by us for the said Benefice of Easington, shall cease to form part of the endowments of that Benefice and shall be held by us in trust for and as part of the endowments of the said Benefice of Shotton."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Durham.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England on Friday, the 22nd January, 1943, at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Acts, 1939 to 1942, to the amount of £75,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 25th January, 1943, to Saturday, the 30th January, 1943, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
