##### NORTH WEST MIDLANDS ELECTRICITY DISTRICT ORDER, 1928.

Joint Authority: Representative of Workers in the Industry.

The Minister of Labour and National Service hereby gives notice that as soon as may be after the 15th day of February, 1943, he will designate to the North West Midlands Joint Electricity Authority, in accordance with Section 2 (10) of Part I of the First Annex to the Schedule to the North West Midlands Electricity District Order, 1928, the employees' organisations having members in the employment of authorised Undertakers in the District, in order that the organisations so designated may choose a representative of persons employed in connection with the supply of electricity in the District to be a member of the Joint Authority.
