#### NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE ACTS, 1936 TO 1941.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the National Health Insurance Joint Committee and the Minister of Health, acting jointly, and that Committee and the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland, acting jointly, after the expiration of at least forty days from this date, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by the National Health Insurance Acts, 1936 to 1941, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, to make regulations to be entitled the National Health Insurance (Additional Benefits) Amendment Regulations, 1943;

And that, on account of urgency, the National Health Insurance Joint Committee and the Minister of Health, acting jointly, and that Committee and the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland, acting jointly, under Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, made regulations dated December 22, 1942, and entitled the National Health Insurance

(Additional Benefits) Amendment Regulations, 1942, to come into operation forthwith as provisional rules and to continue in force until regulations have been made in accordance with the provisions of Section 1 of that Act.

Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Special Order No. 1 of 1943.

Subject.

1. Contracts the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area around Walwyn's Castle and East Williamston, Pembroke, on 9th January, 1943, to an area comprising the districts situate within approximately 5 miles of Herbrandstone, Pembroke.
