Rune, March 13. The Pope entred yesterday find the 86th year of his Age, and received the Complicates of the Foreign Ministers, the Cardinals, and other Persons of Quality on this eccasion. Signior Erizzo, Ambassador from the Republick of Venice, had his first Audience of the Pope yesterday with the usual Ceremonies. The Employment of Library-keeper of the Fathen, vacant by the death of Cardinal Gazazans, is given to Cardinal North. The Pope has given Dischlore for building a Enterthalment. given Directions for building a Fort at Civita-Vecchia; He has given 1000 Crowns a year to the Hospital of St. Michael out of the Revenues of the Bishoptick of Ofimo. The Great Duke of oTassany is expected here from Florence in the Easter Holidays.

From the Saxon Camp before Riga, Mar. 19. N. S. On the 16th Instant another Detachment of our Forces joined those that had invested the Denamunder Fort, and increased their number to about 2000. The Suedes at Rigo perceiving the Mo-tion of our Troops, fired very warmly upon them with their Cannon, and were answered by ours from the Kober-Schans; Our red Bullets set fire to some Houses in the Town, but twas soon put out, and no great Execution was done on either side. Last night the Suedes, to the number of 100, commanded by the Sieur Tiesenkuysen, sallied out of the Town, but were beaten back with the loss of 150 killed, and the Sieur Tiesenhuysen with several others taken Deisoners. He was brought several others taken Prisoners; He was brought

a very good Officer, and a Man of great Interest among the Gentlemen of Livonia. We are ma-king Preparations to storm the Dunamunder Fort, a Post of great Consequence, and defended by 1000 Suedes. Several Batteries both of Cannon and Mortars are raised against it, and began to play yesterday; 2000 Men more are ordered to join those who lie before the said Fort, and 1000 Dragoons are posted at Magnius Holme, to hinder the Suedes in Riga from sending any Assistance thicker. Count Dahlberg, Governor of Riga, has published a Manisesso, in Answer to that put out by General Fleming at his first coming before this Flace; He therein absolutely denies what was alledged by the faid General, as the reason of his coming into Livenia, viz. That the Sueder were making Preparations to fall upon the Saxons quartered in Lithuania; He also Answers the other parts of General Fleming's Paper, and Exhorts the Gentlemen of Livonia to remain true to their Allegiance, and to come in and affish him to defend Riga, affuring them, that confiderable Succours are

coming from Finland and Sueden.

Mittam, March 19. The Saxons before Riga Mittaw, March 19. have received 20 Pieces of Cannon and 3 Mortars from the Fortress of Birza, and a great many Country People were summoned to bring in Horfest to draw the Artillery that is made use of against the Dunamunder Fort, which the Saxons began to batter yesterday. They fire continually from the Town, and the Saxons do the like from the Keber Fort, but hitherto with little effect on either side. There is a Papara China. on either side. Warfam, March 20. Most of the Persons of Quality who attended the King of Poland to Saxoby are returned hither, and the King is expected in a very short time. The Cardinal Primate is in a very short time. The Cardinal Primate is gone to spend some days at his House at Radziewowsky. Tis faid, he has received a Letter from the King of Poland, acquainting him with the March of his Saxon Forces into Livonia, and defiring the Forces of the Crown may join them; But the Polanders feem to have no inclination to begin a War; And they write from Lithuania, that the Gentlemen of that Dutchy are in the same disposition, and intend to fend Deputies to the King to defire he will raise the Siege of Riga, which occasions a great interruption in their Trade. Drefaen, March 24. The King of Poland is gone from hence to Warfaw. Lieutenant-General War-terstion is lately come hither from the Duke of Saxe-Girra, to adjust Matters with the King of Poland's Ministers, concerning several Regiments which the said Duke offers to put into the King's Service. All the Saxon Troops in these Parts have Orders to be in a readiness to march upon the first Orders. Count Welling, Envoy from the King of Sueden, is gone from hence to the Court of Hansver,

Hanover. March 27. The Elector of Hanover has given Orders for new Levies to be made for recruiting his Forces, which are to be compleat, and in a readiness to march by the 5th of the next month, being as 'tis said to join the Duke of

Cell's Troops, and to assist the Duke of Holstein.
Francfert, March 28. The French at Brisac are preparing to evacuate that Place, and have fixed the first of the next month for delivering the same to the Germans. They have already fent away part of the Garrison, and most of their Baggage, and have made a Bridge of Boats on the Rhine, over which the rest of the Garrison is to march out of the Town. General Thungen in the mean time is come into the Neighbourhood of that Place with 5000 Imperial Forces and 70 Pieces of Cannon, in order to take Possession of the Town in the Emparor's Name, and a great quantity of Provisions and Ammunition is getting ready at Mentz to be fent thither.

Hamlurgh, March 30. The Danish Forces continue in the Duke of Histein's Territories. There are 4000 at Sleswick, who live upon the Burghers; of which Complaint being made to Major-General Carmilion their Commander, he has thereupon given Orders, that they observe a strict Discipline. The Danes have not yet attacked the new Forts, but have secured all the Paties that may be useful to them, and they are bringing their Artillery nearer to Tenningen, intending, as tis believed, to Bombard that Place. The Letters from Copenhagen fay, the King of Denmark's Coronation is appointed to be on the 15th of April next, and that he intends to take a Journey to Holstein about a week after. They write from Berlin, that the Elector of Brandenburgh's Journey to Prista is still discoursed of, and that the Marriage of the Princels Lewisa-Derothy-Sophia, his Daughter, to the Landgrave of Helfe-Caffel's eideit Son will be Solemnized in Easter week.
