LONDON COUNTY COUNCIL (GENERAL POWERS) ACT, 1927

Street Trading

NOTICE is hereby given that the Council of the Metropolitan Borough of Stepney, at a meeting held on the 10th day of February, 1943; did make, pursuant to the provisions of Section 35 of the London County Council (General Powers) Act, 1927, a Bye-law relating to the trading in streets by Licensed Street Traders.

Now notice is hereby further given that the said Council intend, at the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication hereof, to apply to the Secretary of State for confirmation of the said Bye-law, and that a copy thereof is deposited at the Municipal Offices, Queen Mary College, Mile End Road, E 1, and is open between the hours of 9 30 a m and 5 p m on any weekday (other than Saturday) and between 9.30 a m and 12 noon on Saturday to the inspection of any ratepayer of the Borough or of any street trader, without fee or reward, and further that I, the undersigned, will upon the application of any such ratepayer or street trader furnish a copy of the said Bye-law or any part thereof upon payment of sixpence for every hundred words contained in such copy

Return No. 21/1942—

The number of outbreaks of Anthrax confirmed during the period 1st to 15th November, 1942, was 16 and not 17 as previously stated

The number of animals attacked was 17 and not 18 as previously stated.

The number of outbreaks of Anthrax confirmed during the period 1st January to 15th November, 1942, was 308 and not 309 as previously stated

The number of animals attacked was 337 and not 338 as previously stated

Return No 22/1942—

The number of outbreaks of Anthrax confirmed during the period 1st January to 30th November, 1942, was 331 and not 332 as previously stated

The number of animals attacked was 362 and not 363 as previously stated

Return No 23/1942—

The number of outbreaks of Anthrax confirmed during the period 1st January to 15th December, 1942, was 348 and not 338 as previously stated

NOTE.—The following diseases were eradicated from Great Britain in the years indicated.—Cattle plague or rinder-pest (*pestis bovina*), 1877; pleuro-pneumonia (*peripneumonia contagiosa bovum*), 1898; sheep pox (*variola ovium*), 1850, rabies, 1922; epizootic lymphangitis (*lymphangitis epizootica*), 1906; and glanders (including farcy) (*malleus*), 1928. Dourine (*exanthema cortale paralyticum*) has never existed in Great Britain

No case of Fowl Pest (*pestis avium*) has been confirmed in Great Britain since the 11th January, 1937, the date as from which the disease was first notifiable. So far as is known, however, Fowl Pest has not existed in Great Britain since 1933.
