A large splinter damaged the main plane and the port inner tank, causing I engine to fail. On the return journey, when crossing the Alps, all movable equipment was jettisoned in an effort to maintain height. Much petrol was lost but displaying superb airmanship and great tenacity, Flight Sergeant White flew the damaged aircraft back to this country with I engine out of action. His great skill and courage set a fine example.

One night in December, 1942, Sergeant McLean
was the rear gunner of an aircraft detailed to

manually and, when the aircraft was attacked by
an enemy fighter, his courageous conduct was
worthy of high praise.

A shell, burst in the rear compartment slightly wounding Sergeant Moses and causing small arms ammunition to explode. Pyrotechnics were in danger of becoming ignited but Sergeant Moses, displaying great coolness and initiative, succeeded in jettisoning them. In the face of a trying situation, this airman displayed great resource and rendered valuable assistance to his captain.
