The Danes before the Cattle of Gotorp having prepared their Batteries, the Governor of that Place, feeing twas in no condition of Defence, furrendred on the 23d Instant, and he and his Gar-

rison were made Prisoners of War.

Hamburgh, April 27. The Letters from Coporthagen say, the King of Denmark has put off his Journey to Holftein till the middle of the next Month, and that it's beleived the Danish Fleet will not put to Sea before that time.
