"Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted inter alia that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Orders in Council of the 29th January, 1929, 1st October, 1932, 27th October, 1936, 1st July, 1937, 24th February 1938, 5th September 1939, and 30th May, 1941, authorised payment of extra duty pay to certain Royal Marine ranks when organised in service units:

"And whereas we consider that extra remuneration at the rate of 1s. a day should be paid to

"And whereas we consider that extra remuneration at the rate of is. a day should be paid to Royal Marine ranks qualified and employed as Dock Foremen in the establishment of such units:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction payment accordingly.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 11th day of March, 1943, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—
"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th

and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownerof the Advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Whiteparish in the County of Wilts and in the Diocese of Salisbury: "Whereas we are satisfied that Mabel Bull of Castle House, Buckingham, Widow, is the Patron or

Person entitled to present or nominate to the said Benefice in case the same were now vacant:

"And whereas the said Mabel Bull desires to transfer the Advowson of the said Benefice to the Bishop of Salisbury for the time being and is consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof she has executed the same):

And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right
Reverend Neville, Bishop of Salisbury (in testimony
whereof he has executed this Scheme) we, the said
Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly
recommend and propose that upon and from the day
of the date of the publication in the London Gazette
of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying
this Scheme and without any conveyance or
assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted
Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of
patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Whiteparish shall be transferred to the said Neville, Bishop of Salisbury, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall

forth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Salisbury for the time being."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Salisbury.
