

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries hereby gives notice that the River Clwyd Catchment Board have made application under sub-section (3) of Section 5 of the Land Drainage Act, 1930, that the statutory map of the Catchment Area, be varied so far as relates to the extent of the main river by the addition to and removal from the said main river of certain watercourses.

Plans on the 1 inch and 6 inch scale on which the proposed addition is shown by a line in red colour and the proposed deletion by a line in blue colour may be inspected, together with a copy of the statutory map of the Catchment Area, at the office of the Clerk of the Catchment Board, County Offices, Ruthin, or at the offices of the Ministry.

Any objection to the proposed variation of the statutory map shall be made in writing and sent by post, addressed to the Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, at the address mentioned below, within thirty-one days from the date of this notice.

Application of Part II of the Sheep Scab Order of 1938.

Subject.

Applies the provisions applicable to Movement Areas to an area comprising the counties of Kent and East Sussex and imposes certain other restrictions on the exposure of sheep at Markets, etc., in the area during the period 19th July to 9th September, 1943 (inclusive).

ROAD TRAFFIC ACT, 1930—SECTION 46.
ROAD AND RAIL TRAFFIC ACT, 1933—
SECTION 29.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 24th day of March 1943, the Minister of War Transport modified and confirmed the Solihull Urban District Council (Roads Restriction) (Damson Lane, Solihull) Order, 1942, made by the Solihull Urban District Council under Section 46 of the Road Traffic Act, 1930, and Section 29 of the Road and Rail Traffic Act, 1933.

The effect of the Order is to prohibit the passage of any vehicle, the weight of which whether laden or unladen exceeds three tons, on so much of Damson Lane, Solihull, as is carried by the bridge over the Warwick and Birmingham Canal. The Order also restricts the speed of vehicles on the length of Damson Lane specified to a maximum of ten miles per hour.
