Hague, May 14. The Forces of this State, which are to join with those of the House of Lunenbourg, being 3 Regiments of Horse and 6 of Foot, are marching to the Frontiers of Overssel, and are to be quartered in that Province, that they may be at hand to march towards the Country of Holftein, if there be occasion. Orders are given, to hasten the fitting out of the Dutch Squadron for this Summer's Service.

Parin, May 15. N.S. Monsieur de Ponchar-train, Chancellor of France, took the Oaths on the 9th Instant as Commander and Secretary of the Order of the Holy-Ghost. The next day the Marquis de la Vrilliere was sworn into his Office of Secretary of State. Yesterday the Bishop of Paris held here an Assembly of the Clergy of his Province, to choose Deputies for the General Assembly of the Clergy of this Kingdom, which is to meet the 25th Instant, and the Bishop of Meaux, and the Abbe Bossuet his Nephew, were elected. The States-General of the Dutchy of Burgundy are to meet at Dyon on the 22d Instant, and the Prince of Conde is gone thither upon this occasion.
