Kinfale, April 16. .

N Wednesday last came in here the Robert of this place from Legorn and bound for Dublin, informing us, that on the 22 pass, they pass by three Hollaud men of War of 45, 50, and 56 Guns, which were engaged in Fight off the south-Cape with two Algier men of war, ot 44 Guns apiece, between whom passed many Broad fides, but with what fuccels they can give no account.

The fame day came in here the Fosch of Briffel laden with Tobacco from Virginia, and homewards bound with the first fair wind.

Falmouth, April 22. Yesterday arrived here the Fortune of this place from Amsterdam, telling us, that the squadron of 12 men of war designed for the Streights under the Command of the Heer Van Ghent, are fitted up for that Voyage, and may fail with the first fair wind.

The fame day arrived the Virgin of this place from Rechelle, informing that the French Weft-India Fleet are put to fea, and that feveral men of War may in few days put to fea defigned for the fuccors of Candia.

Malaga, April 2 The 28th paft failed hence 15 fail of English thips, three of them bound for Cadis, the test for several Ports of England 3 the 30th paft; came in here 13 fail more of English from Zanis, Apulia, Legorn and Tunis.

We are here informed of a late encounter between three Durch men of War and two of Algiers, which lasted for fome hours, but the Commander of the Durch squadron Vander-Zaen being unfortunately flain by a Broadfide, the Turks had the opportunity of getting away.

Venice, April 12. Letters of the 5th pail from Conftantipople inform us, that the French Ambassador having not been able to obtain leave of the Caymakan for his return home, was then ready to pass thence for Lariffa to defire it personally from the Grand Segnior, that in the mean time four French men of war were entred into the Port at Constantinople, where 'twas stid, they were arrelted i at the fame time, 3000 men lay ready at Constantinople to be fent to the affistance of the Visier in his Siege of Candie, burthele were not Janisaries as was given out amongs the people, but men raised in haste for that fervice, and not at all, werfed in the wars.

The Count de Furstemberg is daily expected here, who is to command the Regiment of 1000 men, who are on their march from Bavaria, and are every day expected at Verona.

The Senste is providing for the defence of Cattaro, for which a large Fregat is now I ding with all forts of provifions, and the next week leveral Gompanies of Pose may be fort away for the be tet defence of that place.

Venice, April 20. A fhip arriving here from Mellina confirms to us the great irruption of the Flames and Afhes from leveral Mountainsnear Ætna ruining all the Countrey for above 15 miles in length within two miles of Catania, accompany'd with Thundet and Earthquykes.

The Mafter of this fhip rells us, that leaving Meffina the laft of March, he met with a Pick which came from the Levant, intending for Maltha, who told him, that the Captain Baifa was at Negropone fitting up his Gallies, expecting the arrival of leveral others from Conflantinople laden with Men and Provisions for the fuccor of the Vifier before Candia, but had net as yet many men aboard him for the fervice; adding, that two fquadrons of our Fleer

were cruifing in the Archipelage attending the motions of these Gallies, with a defign to engage them, and had already taken feveral Saichs and other Veffels laden with Men and Provisions for the relief of the Visiers Camp, who is more then ever earneft in his Siege; intending 40 ule all his Arts for the gaining of the place before the arrival of thole great fuccors which are expected this Summer, which lie fears may oblige him to raile it, to his great difhonour after the expence of formuch times men and Moneys ; to which end he plyes them with his Cannon and Granadors and especially by his Mines in which he reposes most confidence, and upon all advantages he receives by them gives furious aflaults to the Town, but by the excellent conduct of the General and Monsieur de St. Andre Montbrun (who to the great fatisfaction and encouragement of the belieged, is perfectly recovered of his hurt) they have hitherto been in all places entertained with fuch infinite courage and fuccefs that they have in all their' attempts been beaten off with great luss of men, and little hurt and prejudice to the Томл.

From Configntinople we are affured, that the ill fuccels of the Vifier in his Siege, has filled the City and Countrey with great difcontents and murmurings against the Government, on which the people warmly charge all their wants and fufferings.

Two Gallies arrived yesterday from Dalmatia, who are to be paid off their Arrears, to be refurnished with men and other necessaries and fent away for Candia.

Here is now in readiness a confiderable Convoy which may fail with the first fair wind for *Candia*, by which the Senate has fant the summe of 200 thousand Ducats to be distributed amongst the Soldiers within the Town; with this Convoy is sent as Commander the Noble Aluise Priuli.

Legorne, April 16. Letters from Meffina in Sicily, confirm to us the great confternation of the inhabitants near Catania and the adjacent places at the terrible flames which lately issued out of the Atna ; affirming that on the 11th of March last there happened an extraordinary Thunder and Lightning, which was immediately followed with fuch violent tremblings of the Earth, that many Buildings were thrown down by its violence ; and the Mountain above Ma'paffo opening at the fame time, threw up fuch quantities of Brimftone, Fire, Smoke, and Athes, as infinitely terrified the Neighbourhood, and feemed to threaten the whole Island with destruction. This great body of Fire in little time divided it felf into three parts, one branch of i: falling upon the Lands of the Amunciata di Bu-onpileri, di Maffa Lucia, and di Santo Pietro 5 every where deftroying all things in its way, with feveral of the peoples, who has not timely conveyed themfelves to a great The fecond drove with as much fury upon Lar diffance. Guardia di Putielli, the Towr of Malpaffo, and Campo Rotondo ; and the White Monastery within three miles of Catanis. The third coming on with as much violence as far as the Plain of Catania, warmly allaruming the City, which had immediately their recourse to Heaven + exposing their most Szcred Relicks as in a time of the greatest danger and extremity; and to adde to their calamity, and to drive them farther into despair, some few nights after this first Eruption, the Mountain at ove Buonpeleri. tent forth as great a flame as the other, with fuch a prodigious quantity of Afhes as covered the whole Countrey ; then and the following days to fi ling the air, that the day could fearcely be distinguisht from the night; and all this accompanied with
