Pendeunius April 26. J Everal ships which some dayes lince put in here from Bur deaux, are again gone out to lea, bound homewards for their leveral and respective Ports. Yeferday arrived here two Spanish ships from the Bay of Bifcay , bound for London ; their lading moltly Orenges and Lemmons : alio one Vetel from Portugal laten with Sale, intended for Lyme, and faveral fmall Vel-

fels of this place from France. Naples 5 April 9. This week the Posts and Carriers between this and Rome were robbed by the Banditi, who appeared in a Trcop of 120 perfons, under the Command of a Leader they have chosen to themselves, and called by the Name of the Blind-man of Nufco; the prize they met with amongst the paffengers, amounts to the value of 2000 Ducats : having allo taken priloner one Papiris Pellegriza (who has fince elcaved again out of their hands) one of the richest Merchan s of Lecca, whom they intended to have put to his ranfome ; as they would also have dealt with feveral others of the fame profession in his company, had they not laved themselves by the swiftness of their Horses. The number of these Thieves is of late much increased, as are the milchiefs they are acting in the Countrey, having lately plundered several Towns, and particularly Piesca, Lanciana, and Bracigliano.

Rome, April 13. The three Ambaliadors of Obedience from the Republick of Lucca having been conducted to Civite Vecebia by a Genoue Gally, On Sunday laft in the Afternoon made their Publick Entry in Cardinal Refpigliof's Coach by the Gate Flaminia, attended by a Train of above 50 Coaches with fix Horles belonging to the Cardinals, Amballadors, and great Perfons about the Town; and were the fame Evening introduced with the utual Formalities to kils His Holine's Foot : giving sterwards their Visits and Complements to Cardinal Kofpigliofi, with fome others of the Popes near Relations. The Tuelday following they made another Entry on Horsback, preceded by the Popes Horie-guards and a great number of the Nobility and Gentry; after whom came the Popes Guard of Switzers's and then the Ambafiadours accompanied by many Prelates ; and followed by a great Train of Pages and Lacqueys in rich Liveries.

On Monday the Pope held a Confistory in the Vatican where the Cardinals and Bithops being allembled, gave sheir Votes and Suffrages for the admittion of Peter de Alcantara and Magdaten & Pazzt into the Society and Number of the Saints ; the Queen of Smedeland having taken up a private place, where undifeovered the had a view of that Ceremony.

Here is lately arrived on a Gally from Gendua Segnior Gio. Lucca Duraggo, with two of his Brethren, to nego-tiate about the affairs of that Republick ; as also Cavalier. Gie. Carlo Spinola, with ibme other eminent Perlons of his Family, rocomplement the Cardinal his Brother , and vifit him affer his late dangerous diffemper.

The Count de St, Paul who had intentions to advenute a fecond time into the fervice of the Venetians against the Turk, is by Letters from His Mos Christian Majelly re-called, and my fudden'y embart himself with the Duke de Mevers on their return for France.

Our provisions for the Relief of Candia are carried on

The Lieurenant General Cavalier, Nicolo Banchieri is gone for Civita Vechia, to haftemout the Gallies to Here is alfo arrived the Commander Lorenzo de Vic-Sea chi, a Perlon much efteemed for his great Conduct and Skill in Maritime affairs , who is to accompany the General Bart ly Vincenzo Rofpigliofi in this Expedition.

On Thurlday was held a Publick Confiftory, wherein the Lucca Ambailadours were with much Geromony admitted to their Publick Audience, wherein one in the name of the reft in a folemn Latine Oration complemented the Pope upon his happy Entrance into his Government ; and declared the Obedience of that Republick to the See of Rome ; and in the Afternoon began their Vifits to the Colledge.

Bruffells, May 3. From Lille we are told, that the French have defigned three places of Arms, one at Aeth, a fecond at Douay, and a third between Tournay and Lilles continuing to put great quantities of all forts of Military Provisions into their leveral Magazines ; but more especially into those of Denay and Arras : and employ all the hands they are able to procure, for the perfecting of their Fortifications, the French King being unwilling to hearken to any Propolals of making an exchange for the places of his They are at Dunkerker as well as at Marilate Conquests. mont, preparing to receive his faid Majefty upon his Progrefs or March into these Countreys ; he, continuing his re-Iolution of taking a view this Summer of all his Magazines and Forts. Monlieur de Louvoy is in few dayes expetted at Tournay.

The Baron de Bergeick on Monday last returned from hence to Lills, from, whence we are faither informed that the Intendant of that place, has this last week committed the Greffier of the Countrey of Gorgue to prison, and put him into Irons, for refuting to fwear fidelity to the Crown of France ; which is the more difcourfed on, the faid Greffier having been preferred to that Charge by the Spanish Governour , to which Countries we know not what pretentions the French can have, this Country baving no dependence upon any of their Towns 3 an account of which proceeding has been given by our Commissioners so the Constable of Caffille.

On Monday last arrived here the Count Dona and the Baron de Waffenaer from Holland , to negotiate with the Confishle about the affairs of the Prince of Orange, for the payment of fome moneys due to him from Spain.

This next week the Conftable of Caffille intends for Antwerp, to lettle the Subfidies which are yearly to be paid to his Catholick Majefly , but have of late been ftopped by the Citizens till they can receive fatisfaction in the hupprefion of their new Cultoms,

By the Courrier from Spain we are advised, that Don Fuan continued ftill as Guadalanara, that most of the members of the Council of State were at the prefere either indisposed or resired for their Diversilement ; and that the Grands of Spain are not yar refolved upon the eftablishment of the Kings new Regiment of Guards.

Bruges, May S. On Thus Iday Morning laft happened # great ftorm upon these Coafts, in which one English Veffel laden with Burter was eak away in the mouth of the Har-bour of Oftend , and one Irile Vestel laden with Tallow and Hides, between Oftend and Nienport ; but their more all fayed.

The great apprehentions of the return of the Infection into this City, by reason of the late ludden death of feveral. people, make our Neighbours jealous of holding a Correstrance to any passer of the late come from hence, without a Bill of Health: the like Caution being also used by feveral of the Towns of Zealand.

Hague, May 5. The Affembly of the States of Holland which was intended to have been held the 7th inftant, is put off till the 14th, by which time the Deputies of Zealand, who went home to be prefent at their Election of Magistrates during this Vacation, may be again exploded hese. The Swedith Envoye the Heer Marethal is lately departed hence for Amferdum, but may speedidy return again. Several Conferences have been lately had with the Deputies of the Admiralties for the setting apart Convoys for the fafety of our Trade, and for several other affairs belonging to the Marine.

Letters from Gadiq confirm to is the late Engagement of the Commander-Van der Zaen ind Captain Swarts the 17. of the laft Moneth with the er Corlairs of Algiers, two of whom fled awit with all the fail they were able upon the first onlet, the other Algeriae their Admiral, called the Sun; having aboard her 40 Guns and 500 men, defended her felf with much refutation, and whilf thefe two Cap tains endeavoured toget on each fide of her, the better to reduce her to obedience, the Corlair let fly a Broad fide, by which Van der Zaen being unh-ppily killed, and his flip by his lofs not eafily commanded, the Turks had the opportunity of faving themfelves. The Body of Vander Zaen was afterwards feat to Cediq upon a Datch Metchant A ip thicker bound; the Men of War failing for Lisbonne, where they intend to refit for farther fervice.

Paris, May 7. His Majefty continues at St. Germains, where the Popes Nuntio has been lately to attend him, with much earnerfnefs representing to him, that he has lately teceived feveral informations of frequent affemblies held in the Hoftel de Longneville; wherein fome Propofitions lave been made and Methods propoled for the effablithment of a Patriarch in France, by that means entirely to ruin the Pope's Authority in this Kingdom; urging the necefficy of vinely preventing such Counfels in their birth, which endevoured to make a Schisme in the Church, and could not but be prejudicial allo to the Peace and Conftitutions of the State.

The forces which are intended for Sr. Germains', will not be encamped before the ao h of this Moneth, for whole entrusinment great provisions' a e made; but their numbers nor like to be lo confiderable as was at first intended : and 'ris believed will not exceed 5 or 6000 men. From Lorrain we are told of the arrival at Naney of a Coursier from the Prince of Lorrainy advising the Duke' of the good dispositions of the Poles to elect him to that Crown; but withal prefing for a speedy allitance of 400³ wonland F anckato be employed in that affair.

From Rome we are informed, that while fome debates about the Reception of the Count de Prado, who is daily expected there from Portugal, it has been refolved that he be received, as Amballadour not from the King, but Crown of Portugal: but as yet the Pope has fome for up es about the Recommendation of fuch perions as are to be eleSted into the Vscant Bishopricks of that Kingdom.

London, May 1. On Monday last His Majesty accompanied by his Royal Highnels and his Highnels Prince Rupers, attended by feveral of his Nobility and Perfons of the Court, went from hence to New Market, to divert himfelf in the Conntrey thereabouts; and this Morning returned again hither. His Highnels the Prince of Tufsany, having allo taken part of those diversions, is gone to take a view of the University of Cambridge; defising tobe treated there as in other parts incegniso, and to wave thole publick Honours with which the faid University intended to have received him.

Cambridge, May 2. Yesterday the first in-ftant arrived here his Highness the Prince of Tuscany from Newmarket, where he had been fome dayes with his Majefty diverting himfelf with the recreations of that place. At his arris vall he was received with all the respect imaginable by the University and Town, being attended at his Lodgings and complemented in the Name of the University by the I wo Divinity Proteffors, accompanied by all the young Noblemen now Students there, and by the Mayou and Aldermen from the Town; which done, his Highness being pleased to go abroad, the Vice-Chancellor, with the Doctors and both the Broctors, flood ready in their Habits of formality to receive him at the Publick Schools, all the Scholars of the University being ranged also in their formalities on each fide of the way by which he passed : the Publick Orator entertaining him with a Speech at the Gate, from whence his Highness was conducted into the Regent House; where was held a Congregation for Creating in all Degrees and Faculties on this occasion, by the particular Command of His Majesty; where a second Speech was made to him by the fame Orator.

In the Afternoon he was pleafed to be prefent at a Philosophy Act appointed for that purpose by the University in the usual form, which was performed to the great fatisfaction of the Prince and whole Auditory.
